## West Virginia University 2012 Final Football Notes 7-6 overall record/4-5 Big 12 (Tied 5th) New Era Pinstripe Bowl



### The 2012 Season

✓ West Virginia posted a 7-6 overall record for the 2012 season and 4-5 mark in the Big 12 Conference. The Mountaineers have won at least seven games in a season 48 times and this year marked the 12th consecutive time with seven or more wins. WVU finished in a tie for fifth place in its first year as a member of the conference.

West Virginia started the season ranked No. 11 nationally and stayed in the polls for 10 straight weeks, including five weeks in the Top 10. The Mountaineers climbed as high as No. 4, after defeating Texas in Austin on Oct. 6.

WVU was one of nine conference teams to make a bowl in 2012, when it made its school record 11th straight bowl appearance against Syracuse in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl.

### Big 12 Attendance

✓ West Virginia had 391,409 fans visit Milan Puskar Stadium in 2012 for an average of 55,915. The Mountaineers finished No. 5 in the league behind Texas (100,884), Oklahoma (85,243), Texas Tech (57,208) and Oklahoma State (56,556).

### Big 12 Honors

✓ West Virginia had five selections to the all-Big 12 Conference team in 2012. Leading the way on the first team were receivers Tavon Austin and Stedman Bailey and Austin was a first-team selection as the kickoff/punt returner. Quarterback Geno Smith and center Joe Madsen were second-team honorees.

- ✓ WVU has won 97 of its last 131 regular-season games and 101-of-140 overall games.
- ✓ WVU has the 14th-best record in college football in the last eight years (2005-12).
- ✓ WVU has the 14th-best record in college football in the last nine years (2004-12).
- ✓ WVU has the 14th-best record in college football in the last 10 years (2003-12).
- ✓ WVU has outrushed its opponents in 71-of-95 games; WVU's record is 71-24 during that span.
- ✓ WVU is 67-7 since 2002 when winning the turnover battle.
- ✓ Since 2000, WVU is 82-6 when scoring 30 or more points in a contest.
- ✓ Since 2002, WVU is 53-4 when it has held an opponent under 100 yards rushing.
- ✓ WVU QB Geno Smith is No. 1 on the WVU career passing chart (11,662) and career total offense (12,004).
- ✓ Smith is WVU's career leader in completions (988), attempts (1,465) and passing touchdowns (98).
- ✓ Smith is No. 2 nationally in completion percentage (71.3), tied for No. 3 in total passing yards (4,205), No. 4 in points responsible for (20.3) and completions per game (28.4), tied for No. 5 in passing yards per game (323.5), No. 6 in pass efficiency (163.9) and No. 8 in total offense (335.1).
- ✓ WVU receiver Tavon Austin is WVU's career reception (288) and yardage (3,413) leader.
- ✓ Austin is No. 1 in WVU career all-purpose yards (7,286) and No. 2 in touchdown receptions (29).
- ✓ WVU receiver Stedman Bailey is No. 1 on WVU's receiving touchdown list for most in a season (25) and career (41).
- ✓ Bailey holds WVU's all-time record for 100-yard receiving games (14).
- ✓ Austin is tied for No. 3 nationally in catches per game (8.8), No. 2 in all-purpose yards (2230.9), No. 13 in receiving yards per game (99.2) and No. 29 in kickoff returns (25.4).
- ✓ Austin, who won the 2012 Paul Hornung Award and finished No. 8 in the Heisman voting, finished with 572 all-purpose yards against Oklahoma, a Big 12 single-game record and the second-best mark in NCAA history.
- ✓ Bailey, a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award, is tied for No. 3 nationally in scoring (11.5), No. 3 in receiving yards per game (124.8), tied for No. 3 in receptions per game (8.8) and No. 25 in all-purpose yards (137.0) per game.
- ✓ WVU is one of two schools nationally to have had a 4,000-yard passer and a pair of 1,000-yard receivers (Texas Tech).
- ✓ WVU is one of four schools in the nation to have a pair of 1,000-yard receivers (Duke, Oregon State, Texas Tech).

#### 2012

- ✓ Led football program into its first year of competition in the Big 12 Conference
- ✓ Guided West Virginia to a 7-6 overall record in 2012 and an appearance in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl
- ✓ Earned national rankings in 10 of 15 weeks of 2012 season in both the *AP* and *USA Today* Coaches Polls, reaching as high as No. 4 in *USA Today* Coaches' Poll and No. 5 in the *AP* Poll
- ✓ Two Mountaineer players earned 18 All-America honors
- ✓ Tavon Austin and Stedman Bailey are one of four sets of 1,000-yard receivers nationally
- ✓ WVU was one of only two schools nationally to have a 4,000-yard passer and a pair of 1,000-yard receivers
- ✓ WVU was ranked No. 9 nationally in scoring offense and No. 10 in passing offense and total offense.
- ✓ Austin was the recipient of the Paul Hornung Award, the nation's most versatile player
- ✓ Austin was named the Big 12 Conference co-Special Teams Player of the Year

- ✓ In 2010, was named a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award, signifying the top assistant coach in college football and named the rivals.com national offensive coordinator of the year
- ✓ In 2010, the Cowboys led the nation in total offense during the regular season and finished No. 2 in passing offense and No. 3 in total and scoring offense.
- ✓ OSU averaged 520.23 yards per game in total offense, including 345.9 passing yards and 44.23 points per game.
- ✓ The Cowboy offense ranked No. 61 nationally in total offense in 2009, the year before Holgorsen arrived, and he took it to the No. 1 spot in 2010.
- ✓ Quarterback Brandon Weeden became the first OSU passer to earn first team all-Big 12 honors. He was a finalist for the Manning Award, given to the top quarterback in the nation.
- ✓ Receiver Justin Blackmon was named the recipient of the 2010 Biletnikoff Award, given to the top receiver in the nation, and running back Kendall Hunter was a finalist for the Doak Walker Award, given to the nation's top running back.
- ✓ Weeden, Hunter and Blackmon became only the second trio in NCAA history to pass for at least 3,000 yards, run for more than 1,500 yards and finish with more than 1,500 yards receiving in the same season.

## Houston

- ✓ In 2009, UH led the nation in total offense with 563 yards per game, scoring offense with 42.2 points per game, and passing offense with 433.7 yards per game.
- ✓ In 2008, his first year at Houston, the Cougars ranked second in the nation in passing offense (401.6) and total offense (562.77). UH scored 40.62 points per game to rank 10th nationally.
- ✓ Houston quarterback Case Keenum led the nation in total offense in 2008 and 2009, with 403.15 yards of total offense per game as a sophomore and 416.36 yards of offense as a junior.
- ✓ Keenum ranked among the nation's top-10 passing efficiency leaders each of his two seasons under Holgorsen's watch.

## Offensive Output Under Holgorsen

✓ Since 2005, Dana Holgorsen has been the mastermind behind some of the nation's most prolific offenses. Starting as the offensive coordinator at Texas Tech, then Houston and Oklahoma State, and now as the head coach at West Virginia, his offensive units are known for their ability to move the ball, pile up yardage and score a plethora of points.

- ✓ During his tenure as offensive coordinator, the Red Raiders increased their offensive numbers from 324.8 yards per game to 529.6 yards per game.
- ✓ In 2007, Texas Tech led the nation in passing offense (470.31 yards per game), ranked second in total offense (529.62 yards per game) and was seventh in scoring offense (40.92 points per game).
- ✓ Quarterback Graham Harrell led the nation in total offense and receiver Michael Crabtree led the nation in receptions per game and receiving yards per game. Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award as America's top receiver in 2007.
- ✓ In 2006, the Red Raiders ranked third nationally in passing offense and sixth in total offense. Harrell was third nationally in total offense with 344.38 yards per game.
- ✓ In 2005, Texas Tech led the nation in passing offense with 388.83 yards per game, was fourth in scoring offense at 39.42 points per game and was sixth in total offense with 495.83 yards per contest.
- ✓ Quarterback Cody Hodges ranked second in the country with 369.08 yards per game.

#### Wingate

- ✓ Coached Lucas Greene who led the team in scoring that season and went on to play in the NFL

#### Mississippi College

- ✓ Mississippi College won the American Southwest Conference in its first season in the league and averaged 432.0 yards per game in 1997.

#### Valdosta State

- ✓ Helped develop quarterback Chris Hatcher, who set an NCAA record, completing 74.7 percent of his passes on the Division II level in 1994.
- ✓ Hatcher's 10,588 passing yards ranked third on the NCAA career list at the time.
- ✓ Hatcher currently ranks second in the NCAA record books in career touchdown passes (116) and third in single-season touchdown passes (50 in 1994) and was the NCAA passing champion in 1994.

#### No Stranger to Bowl Games

- ✓ The 2012 New Era Pinstripe Bowl marked the second bowl game that Dana Holgorsen has coached in as a head coach and second at West Virginia. However, he is not a stranger to bowl games, as the Pinstripe Bowl was his 13th straight bowl game he coached in - as an assistant or head coach, two at West Virginia, one at Oklahoma State, two at Houston and eight at Texas Tech. In the 13 bowl games in which Holgorsen coached in, his teams have posted an 8-5 record.

# West Virginia's Last Game - The New Era Pinstripe Bowl

## Syracuse 38, West Virginia 14



**BRONX, N.Y. (Dec. 29, 2012)** - Syracuse looked right at home in the frigid elements, defeating West Virginia, 38-14, in the 2012 New Era Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium in the Bronx, N.Y.

The Orange (8-5) used a powerful ground game that produced a 200-and a 100-yard rusher, were able to take advantage of the slippery conditions to slow the Mountaineers' sixth-ranked passing attack.

Prince-Tyson Guley ran 26 times for 213 yards and two touchdowns, and Jerome Smith added 152 yards on 29 carries to become the first duo to crack the 100-yard barrier against a Mountaineer defense in 2012. Syracuse had 369 yards rushing for the game.

West Virginia quarterback Geno Smith came into the game ranked sixth in the nation in total offense (346.5 ypg.) and was the first quarterback in WVU history to throw for more than 4,000 yards in back-to-back seasons, but the senior finished his career winless against the Orange.

West Virginia chased points from the moment Syracuse nose tackle Jay Bromley blocked Tyler Bitancurt's 46-yard field goal attempt on the game's opening possession.

Syracuse led 12-7 at halftime behind a safety, a Ross Krautman 25-yard field goal and a Guley 33-yard touchdown run. The Orange erupted for three second-half touchdowns, scored another safety when Smith was called for intentional grounding in the end zone, and added a second Krautman field goal from 36-yards out.

A key moment in the game occurred early in the third quarter after Syracuse had taken a 19-7 lead on a Ryan Nassib to Beckett Wales 10-yard touchdown pass. On the ensuing possession, the Mountaineers used a 59-yard Smith to Stedman Bailey screen pass to get the football to the Orange 36.

Three plays later, on a fourth and two, it appeared as if tailback Andrew Buie scored on a 28-yard touchdown run, which would have closed Syracuse's lead to five, but the Mountaineers were penalized for holding - one of 11 flags thrown against WVU in the game.

West Virginia was forced to punt after the penalty but immediately got the football right back, when linebacker Isaiah Bruce stepped in front of a Nassib pass at the Syracuse 25. However, the Mountaineers gave it right back, when the football slipped out of Smith's hand on the next play as he was attempting to pass, and the Orange recovered the loose ball. On Syracuse's first play from scrimmage after the fumble recovery, Guley broke the game wide open with a 67-yard touchdown run.

Three minutes later, Guley tallied his third score on a 10-yard pass from Nassib to give

Syracuse a commanding lead.

Both West Virginia touchdowns were produced by Bailey, who broke free on a screen pass for a 32-yard TD in the second quarter and then beat Syracuse defensive back Braddon Reddish down the sideline for a 29-yard touchdown with 5:41 left in the third quarter. Bailey's score closed Syracuse's lead to 26-14.

The loss represented a disappointing ending to the fabulous careers of Smith, Bailey and Tavon Austin.

Smith completed 19-of-28 passes for 201 yards and two touchdowns. Bailey caught eight passes for 121 yards and two TDs. Austin led West Virginia with 45 yards rushing and finished the game with 150 all-purpose yards. All three players virtually rewrote the WVU record book and hold just about every offensive mark.

West Virginia finished its inaugural Big 12 season with a 7-6 record, and the Pinstripe Bowl marked a school-record 11th-straight bowl appearance by the Mountaineers.

There are six Mountaineers with at least 30 starts and nine with at least 20 starts during their career.

## Non-Conference Play

✓ West Virginia finished the 2012 non-conference schedule with a 3-1 record, defeating Marshall, 69-34, in the season opener on Sept. 1, then James Madison, 42-12, at FedExField in Landover, Md., in game two on Sept. 15, and Maryland, 31-21, at home in game three on Sept. 22 in the regular season. In the 2012 New Era Pinstripe Bowl, Syracuse defeated West Virginia, 38-14.

West Virginia has won five straight non conference regular-season games and has claimed a 50-20 non-conference record since 2000, including 33-5 at home, 10-9 on the road and 7-6 at a neutral site.

### In Bowls

✓ West Virginia holds a 14-18 all-time record in bowl games, dating back to the 1922 East-West Game. The 2012 New Era Pinstripe Bowl was WVU's 32nd bowl appearance.

The 2012 season marked the 11th consecutive year that West Virginia has gone to a bowl game, marking the first time in school history.

The old record of 10 in a row was from 2002-11, when the Mountaineers made trips to the Continental Tire Bowl, four Gator Bowls, Sugar Bowl, a Fiesta Bowl, the Meineke Car Care Bowl, the Champs Sports Bowl and Discover Orange Bowl.

### 11 Straight Bowls

✓ West Virginia's appearance in the 2012 New Era Pinstripe marked the 11th straight bowl appearance by the Mountaineers, dating back to the 2002 Continental Tire Bowl. The 11 straight bowl appearances are a school record and ranks No. 8 in the country along with Boise State and Wisconsin. Florida State has been to 30 straight bowl games, Florida has been to 21 straight and Virginia Tech has been to 19 straight.

### National Polls

✓ West Virginia started the season ranked No. 11 and stayed in the national polls for 10 straight weeks, including five weeks in the Top 10.

The Mountaineers dropped out of the polls on Nov. 4, marking 15 weeks, dating back to the Nov. 6 poll in 2011, that WVU was not ranked in at least one of the two major polls.

Since 2002, West Virginia was ranked in the Top 25 for 103 weeks, including 40 weeks in the Top 10.

### Against Ranked Teams

✓ Beginning with a 27-0 loss to Fordham on Oct. 18, 1941, West Virginia has played 138 games against nationally ranked teams. Of those, 41 have been Mountaineer victories. Since 2001, WVU has posted 17 victories over ranked teams. Baylor was ranked No. 25, Texas No. 11, Kansas State was No. 4 and Oklahoma No. 13. The Mountaineers have won four of their last six games against ranked opponents.

### Rolling After Bowling

✓ In the 31 seasons after going to a bowl, the Mountaineers have compiled a 232-126-5 record. WVU has earned back-to-back bowl berths 17 times, including 11 straight, currently a school record.

### The Numbers From Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven, Eight, Nine and 10

✓ The West Virginia Mountaineers have been one of the best teams in college football in the last 10 years.

West Virginia's two-year win total (2011-12) of 17 is tied with Penn State for 30th-best in college football.

West Virginia's three-year win total (2010-12) of 26 wins is tied for 23rd-best in college football with Michigan and Florida.

West Virginia's four-year total (2009-12) of 35 wins ties for 18th-best with Nevada and Penn State, while WVU's five-year victory total of 44 wins (2008-12) is 21st-best.

West Virginia's six-year (2007-12) win total of 55 is tied with Utah and Penn State for 16th best in college football, and its 66 victories in the last seven years (2006-12) is the 14th-best record. Over the past eight years (2005-12), the Mountaineers have won 77 football games and that total is good enough for the 14th-best record in the country.

West Virginia has 85 wins in the last nine years (2004-12), which is the 14th-best mark in college football. And finally, West Virginia's 93 wins in the last 10 years (2003-12) gives the Mountaineers the 14th-best record in college football behind Alabama in 13th-place.

### Troopers Assigned

✓ Two West Virginia State Police troopers are assigned to the Mountaineer football detail for the 2012 season. They were Trooper Glenn Doyle and Trooper Matt Horne. This marks the 20th year of troopers' assignments to Mountaineer football.



## Two At The Top

✓ West Virginia was one of only two schools in 2012 to boast having a 4,000-yard passer and a pair of 1,000-yard receivers.

WVU's Geno Smith completed 369-of-518 passes for 4,205 yards and 42 touchdowns. He led the nation in touchdown passes.

Tavon Austin finished with 114 catches for 1,259 yards and 12 touchdowns, and Stedman Bailey collected 114 catches for 1,622 yards and 25 touchdowns. Bailey led the nation in touchdown receptions, and both he and Austin were only four receptions behind the national leader, Marqise Lee of USC with 118.

Texas Tech also finished with a 4,000-yard passer and a pair of 1,000-yard receivers.



## Mountaineer Set WVU Total Offense Record For Second Straight Year

✓ West Virginia finished with 400 or more yards of total offense in nine of the 13 games during the 2012 season, collecting 500 or more yards five times and 600 or more yards four times.

The Mountaineers finished with a school record-best 807 yards against Baylor and also turned in performances of 778 yards against Oklahoma, 655 yards against Marshall, 647 against Kansas and 569 against James Madison.

WVU was No. 3 in the Big 12 Conference in total offense and No. 10 nationally. The Mountaineers had 6,526 yards of total offense in 2012, setting the school's total offense record for the second consecutive year. In 2011, West Virginia set the school record with 6,104 yards.

## Top 10 Passing Offense

✓ West Virginia had the No. 10 passing offense in the nation, averaging 330.2 passing yards per game.

The Mountaineers finished with a school-record 656 passing yards against Baylor. Other top performances for WVU in 2012 included: 448 passing yards against James Madison (fourth-highest in school history), 407 against Kansas, 401 at Oklahoma State, 338 against Maryland, 323 yards against Marshall and 320 against Oklahoma. WVU has finished with 300 or more passing yards 15 times over the past two years.

Second-year head coach Dana Holgorsen's spread offense has paid dividends, as WVU set the school record for passing yards in a season with 4,509 yards in 2011 and posted 4,292 yards in 2012.

When WVU has passed for 250 or more yards over the past 10 years, its record is 19-9 and 39-18 when passing for 200 or more yards.

## Non-Offensive Touchdowns

✓ West Virginia's Tavon Austin returned a punt 76 yards for a touchdown against TCU and a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against Kansas State. The punt return vs. TCU marked the second return for a touchdown by Austin in 2012 and the fifth time he has returned a punt or kickoff for a touchdown during his career.

Earlier in the 2012 season, Doug Rigg picked up a fumble and raced 51 yards for a touchdown against Maryland, and Isaiah Bruce picked up a Marshall fumble and returned it 43 yards for a touchdown in the season opener. WVU had totalled four non-offensive touchdowns during the 2012 season.

The Mountaineers scored six non-offensive touchdowns during the 2011 season, breaking the former best mark of five in 2003, and have scored 35 non-offensive touchdowns since 2001.

## 30 Is Enough

✓ Dating back to 1980, the Mountaineers hold a 164-12-1 record when scoring 30 or more points in a game. During the 1990s, the Mountaineers were 42-4 when scoring 30 or more points in a contest and were 40-2-1 in the '80s when reaching that mark. WVU is 82-6 since 2000 when scoring 30 points or more in a contest.

## Offensive Analysis

✓ Breaking down the West Virginia offensive numbers for the 2012 season, the Mountaineers ran a total of 998 plays, 461 coming on the ground and 537 through the air. The rushing game totaled 2,234 yards for an average of 4.8 yards per carry and 21 touchdowns. The passing attack totaled 4,292 yards, 44 touchdowns and an average of 11.4 yards per completion.

Combine the two and the Mountaineers turned in 6,526 yards of total offense, and 65 offensive touchdowns for an average of 6.5 yards per play, and an average of 39.5 points per game.

Deeper analysis shows that the Mountaineer offense gained 119 first downs by the run and 188 via the pass. On average, West Virginia had 171.8 yards per game on the ground, 330.2 per game passing and 502.0 yards of total offense.

## Average Per Down

✓ Here's a breakdown of how the 2012 West Virginia offense operated on first, second, third and fourth down.

On first down, the Mountaineers ran a total of 456 plays and gained 3,187 yards for a 7.0 average. On second down, the Mountaineers ran 326 plays for 2,260 yards and a 6.9 average. On third down, the Mountaineers ran 182 plays for 928 yards and a 5.1 average gain. West Virginia tried 34 fourth-down plays in 2012, gaining 151 yards for a 4.4 average on fourth down.

WVU's touchdowns came 22 times on first down (4 rushing and 18 passing), 23 times on second down (6 rushing and 17 passing), 16 times on third down (9 rushing, 7 passing) and four touchdowns on fourth down (2 rushing, 2 passing).

## Top 10 Scoring Offense

✓ The Mountaineer offense averaged 39.5 points a game in 2012, ranking No. 9 nationally.

West Virginia scored a season-high 70 points against Baylor and had other top performances of 69 points against Marshall, 59 against Kansas, 49 against Oklahoma, 48 at Texas and 42 against JMU.

Before the JMU contest, WVU's prior three games against USF and Clemson in 2011 and Marshall in game one of the 2012 season set the school record for most points scored (169) in three consecutive games. With 42 points scored against JMU, WVU broke the mark for the second straight week with a three-game total of 181.

## 30 or More Completions

✓ Geno Smith has had 30 or more completions 12 of the 17 times it has happened in school history. He has had 30 or more completions seven times in 2012, including a season-high 45 against Baylor.

He completed 36 at Oklahoma State on Nov. 10, marking the second-highest amount of completions in 2012. Marc Bulger completed at least 30 passes three times, followed by Brad Lewis and Oliver Luck, who each completed the feat once.

Smith completed a school-record 21 straight passes from the first quarter through the end of the game against Kansas and completed 14 straight in the first half against Baylor, breaking Bulger's previous record of 13 set against East Carolina in 1999. Smith completed another 12 straight in the second quarter and then had seven straight in the third quarter.



## Overtime Games

✓ The 39-38 two-overtime loss to TCU in 2012 marked the 10th overtime game in West Virginia history. The Mountaineers own a 5-5 record in overtime games.

West Virginia played its first overtime game against Pitt in 1997, dropping a three-overtime thriller, 41-38.

## On Grass

✓ Since 1980, West Virginia is 47-56 in games played on natural grass surfaces. WVU was 2-1 on grass surfaces in 2012, with a 42-12 win against James Madison at FedEx Field, a 31-24 win over Iowa State at Jack Trice Stadium and a 38-14 loss to Syracuse in the Pinstripe Bowl.

Since 2001, the Mountaineers are 23-20 on natural grass surfaces and 5-1 under Dana Holgorsen. The Syracuse loss broke a six-game winning streak on natural grass surfaces for WVU.

## WVU vs. 2012 Slate

✓ West Virginia owned an 80-63 record against its 2012 opponents. The Mountaineers have winning records over Baylor, Iowa State, James Madison, Kansas, Marshall, Maryland and Texas and are even in their series with Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas Tech. Kansas State and Oklahoma have won two of the three meetings in the series with WVU, and Syracuse has won 33 of the 60 meetings.

## Season Scoring

✓ West Virginia scored 513 points in 2012, an average of 39.5 per game. It ranked second on WVU's single-season points scored list.

The Mountaineers scored 30 or more points in 10 games, 40 or more points in six games and 50 or more points in three games.

WVU scored a season-high 70 points against Baylor, 69 against Marshall and 59 against Kansas. The Mountaineers were third in the Big 12 Conference in scoring offense and No. 9 nationally.

The Mountaineers outscored their opponents in every quarter but the second. WVU outscored its opponents 110-93 in the first quarter, 116-111 in the third and 114-111 in the fourth quarter. WVU was outscored in the second quarter, 172-166.

West Virginia outscored its opponents, 276-265 in the first half (21.2-20.1) and 230-222 in the second half (17.7-17.1). The Mountaineers were outscored 8-7 in overtime.

## Looking at the Offense

✓ West Virginia averaged 502.0 yards of total offense per game in 2012, ranking No. 3 in the Big 12 Conference and No. 10 nationally.

The Mountaineers put up 800 or more yards once, 700 or more yards twice, 600 or more four times, 500 or more yards of total offense in five games and 400 or more yards in nine games.

Since Holgorsen became head coach in 2011, the Mountaineer offense has collected 400 or more yards in 19-of-26 games, 500 or more yards 11 times, 600 or more yards five times, 700 or more yards two times and more than 800 yards once.

In 2012, the Mountaineers finished with a school-record 807 yards of total offense against Baylor. The previous record was 674 yards against Washington & Lee in 1923. The Mountaineers finished with more than 700 yards of total offense against Oklahoma (778) and more than 600 yards against Marshall in the season opener (655) and Kansas in season final (647). WVU collected 569 yards against James Madison and had 479 at Oklahoma State, 475 at Iowa State and 460 at Texas.

The Mountaineers were No. 10 nationally in passing offense per game (330.2) and No. 9 in scoring offense (39.5). Quarterback Geno Smith was tied for No. 5 in the nation (323.5) in passing yards per game and No. 8 in total offense (335.1).

### Throwing for 300 or More Yards

✓ Geno Smith threw for 300 or more yards twice his sophomore year, eight times as a junior and seven more times as a senior to collect 17 career performances of 300 or more yards passing.

Smith broke Marc Bulger's 1998 record of five 300-yard or more passing games to become WVU's top 300-yard passer.

### Scoring 40 or more Points

✓ Under Dana Holgorsen, West Virginia is 10-1 when scoring 40 or more points in a game. Since 2000, the Mountaineers are 42-1 when hitting the 40-point plateau, and WVU is 173-1 all-time when scoring at least 40 points in a game.

### Hitting the Century Mark

✓ West Virginia has had 100-yard receiving performances 14 times during the 2012 season.

The most recent 100-yard receiving performance for WVU was against Syracuse in the PinStripe Bowl, as Stedman Bailey finished with eight catches for 121 yards and two touchdowns.

Against Baylor, WVU had three receivers with more than 10 receptions and more than 100 yards each.

### One of the Nation's Top Passers

✓ Senior quarterback Geno Smith completed 369-of-518 passes for 4,205 yards and 42 touchdowns in 2012. He completed 71.2 percent of his passes and averaged 323.5 yards per game.

Smith was No. 2 in the nation in completion percentage, No. 4 in points responsible for (20.3) and completions per game (28.4), tied for No. 5 in passing yards per game, No. 6 in passing efficiency (163.9) and No. 8 in total offense yards per game (335.1).

Against Kansas in the regular-season finale, he completed 23-of-24 passes for 407 yards and three touchdowns. After throwing a first-quarter interception, he broke his own school record, throwing 21 straight completions for the remainder of the game. His completion percentage (95.8) tied the NCAA single-game record with a min. of 20 pass attempts (first set by Tennessee's Tee Martin vs. South Carolina in 1998).

Against Baylor, he finished with 45-of-51 passing for 88.2 percent, the best completion mark since 2000 with a minimum of 50 pass attempts, breaking the mark of Hawaii's Colt Brennan, who completed 84 percent (42/50) of his passes against Washington in 2007. His passing yards and total offense against the Bears set the national mark in a game in both categories in 2012.

His school-record 656 yards and eight touchdowns marked the first time he had over 600 yards passing. He threw for 411 yards against James Madison, his fourth-highest number of passing yards in his career and the sixth most in school history. His 45 completions also set a school record.

Against JMU, Smith's 142 yards passing in the first quarter were a career-best amount in an opening quarter. He threw for 189 yards in the second quarter against Baylor, posting his career high, and his 166 yards in the fourth quarter also were a career-best amount for him. He had 202 yards in the third quarter against the Bears, which were second to his 217 yards he threw against LSU in 2011.

For his career, he has thrown for 300 or more yards 17 times, 400 or more yards seven times and more than 600 yards once.

### A School-Record Eight Touchdown Passes

✓ Senior quarterback Geno Smith threw for a school-record eight touchdown passes against Baylor, breaking his record of six touchdown passes he completed against Clemson in the Orange Bowl.

His eight touchdowns set a national mark for touchdown passes in a game, besting the six touchdowns thrown by Seth Doege of Texas Tech against New Mexico on Sept. 15 and Zac Dsyert of Miami (Ohio) vs. Akron on Sept. 29.

### Spreading the Wealth

✓ The Mountaineers did an outstanding job of spreading the ball to a variety of receivers in 2012. WVU quarterbacks hooked up with five different receivers against Texas, Oklahoma, Iowa State and Syracuse, six against Baylor, Maryland, Oklahoma State and Kansas, seven against Marshall, Texas Tech, Kansas State and TCU, and a season-high nine against JMU.

Four different targets scored touchdowns against Marshall, three more found the end zone against James Madison, Baylor, TCU and Oklahoma State, two players scored against Texas, Iowa State and Kansas, and one scored against Maryland, Texas Tech, Kansas State, Oklahoma and Syracuse.

Austin (114), Bailey (114), J.D. Woods (61) and Andrew Buie (28) led WVU with the most receptions in 2012.

## Four Pairs for a Grand

✓ West Virginia was one of four schools in the nation to boast a pair of 1,000-yard receivers in 2012. West Virginia's Tavon Austin finished with 114 catches for 1,289 yards and 12 touchdowns, and Stedman Bailey collected 114 catches for 1,622 yards and 25 touchdowns.

Oregon State's Markus Wheaton registered 91 catches for 1,244 yards and 11 touchdowns, while Brandin Cooks had 67 catches for 1,151 yards and five touchdowns.

Duke's Jamison Crowder finished with 76 catches for 1,074 yards and eight touchdowns, and Conner Vernon collected 85 catches for 1,074 yards and eight touchdowns.

Texas Tech's Darrin Moore registered 92 catches for 1,032 yards and 13 touchdowns, while Eric Ward had 82 catches for 1,053 yards and 12 touchdowns.

## More Honors for Tavon

✓ Senior receiver Tavon Austin was named to numerous All-America teams and barely missed being named as a consensus All-American.

He did however earn two national awards for his performance in 2012. Austin was named the winner of the Paul Hornung Award, given to the most versatile player in college football.

He finished No. 2 in the nation in all-purpose yards with a school-record 2,910 yards, averaging 223.8 yards per game. He led the nation in all-purpose yards as a junior with 2,574 yards, averaging 198.0 yards per game.

Austin also was awarded the Jet Award Return Specialist Award. It honored the best return specialist in college football. Award winners must be among the national leaders in return categories and show courage, leadership, desire, respect for authority and discipline.

## Valuable Target

✓ Senior receiver J.D. Woods worked his way into the starting lineup late in the 2011 season and had a solid final season. He provided another target for the Mountaineer passing attack.

For the 2012 season, Woods was the team's third-leading receiver with 61 catches for 637 yards and four touchdowns. He had a long catch of 50 yards against Kansas. He finished the season ranked No. 10 in the Big 12 in receptions per game.

Woods posted his first 100-yard receiving performance of his career against Baylor, finishing with a career-best 13 catches for 114 yards and a touchdown. Against Kansas, he finished with four catches for 83 yards and scored a touchdown.

Against Marshall, he was the third-leading receiver with seven catches for 75 yards and a touchdown. That marked the first touchdown he scored since the first game of the 2010 season against Coastal Carolina.

## Austin Sets Career Reception and Yards Mark

✓ Senior receiver Tavon Austin registered 114 catches for 1,289 yards and 12 touchdowns in 2012. His 114 receptions tied Stedman Bailey for the record, breaking Austin's record of 101 that he set in 2011. He finished with double-figure receptions in eight of the 13 games in 2012 and posted 100 or more yards in six games.

Austin was the sixth WVU player to have 1,000 or more receiving yards in a season. He was the first player in WVU history to post back-to-back 100 or more reception seasons and the second to have back-to-back 1,000-yard receiving seasons.

He had a double-digit reception string of seven straight games from the Orange Bowl to the Kansas State game. He then registered 11 catches for 101 yards and a touchdown against TCU, 11 receptions for 79 yards and a touchdown at Oklahoma State, finished with four catches for 110 yards against Kansas and then had four catches for 30 yards against Syracuse in the Pinstripe Bowl.

Austin tied with Bailey for No. 3 nationally in receptions per game (8.8) and was No. 13 in receiving yards per game (99.2).

His career-best 14 catches against Baylor set the school record and was tied for the 10th-best mark in the nation in 2012. He finished with a personal-best 215 yards receiving against the Bears, which was the third-highest amount of receiving yards in school history. At Texas, he finished with 10 catches for 102 yards and a touchdown, first setting the school record for most 100-yard receiving performances with 11. Bailey currently holds the record with 14 receiving performances of 100-yards or more in a game.

For his career, he currently has a school-record in receptions (288) and yards (3,413 yards). Austin also has 29 career receiving touchdowns, ranking No. 2 to Bailey, who has 41 receiving touchdowns.

## Bailey Breaks School Record for Most 100-Yard Receiving Performances

✓ Junior receiver Stedman Bailey finished the 2012 season with 114 catches for 1,622 yards and 25 touchdowns. He tied Tavon Austin for the most catches in a season in school history and set new WVU records for receiving yards and touchdown receptions in a season.

He was named one of three finalists for the Biletnikoff Award, along with USC's Marqise Lee and Baylor's Terrance Williams.

Bailey collected a school-record 1,622 yards in 2012, breaking the 1,000-point plateau for the second straight year, finishing with a then-school record 1,279 yards in 2011. Bailey was the fifth Mountaineer to finish with 1,000 or more yards receiving in a season and the first to hit the 1,000-yard plateau in back-to-back seasons.

He has registered double-figure catches in five games in 2012 and had 100 or more yards seven times. He was tied for No. 3 nationally in scoring (11.6) and receptions (8.8) and was third in receiving yards per game (124.8).

Bailey set the school record for most receiving yards (303) and receiving touchdowns (5) in a game against Baylor. His 25 receiving touchdowns in 2012 and his 41 career touchdowns are school records. His 14 games with 100 or more yards receiving is school's top mark.

Bailey tied Austin (Baylor) for the school record with 14 catches at Oklahoma State and had 13 catches three times this season, also collecting that amount against James Madison and Baylor. He had 225 yards at Oklahoma State, 205 against Oklahoma, 173 yards against James Madison, 159 against Kansas 121 against Syracuse and 104 against Marshall. He scored two touchdowns against Marshall, Kansas and Syracuse, three against James Madison and at Texas and four against Oklahoma.

For his career, he finished with 210 catches for 3,218 yards and 41 touchdowns. He sits in second place on WVU's career receiving yardage chart and second on the all-time reception list.

### Two Receivers With 200+ and Three Hit the Century Mark

✓ Against Baylor, West Virginia receivers Tavon Austin finished with 14 catches for 215 yards and two touchdowns, Stedman Bailey had 13 receptions for 303 yards and five touchdowns and J.D. Woods collected 13 catches for 114 yards and a touchdown. The last time WVU had three receivers top the 100-yard mark was at Maryland on Sept. 17, 2011. Austin finished with 122 yards, Bailey had 113 yards and Ivan McCartney registered 101 yards.

Austin and Bailey were the first pair of teammates with 200-yards receiving since 2007, when Texas Tech's Danny Amendola and Michael Crabtree both had over 200-yards receiving in a game.

### Mountaineers Set First Down Record

✓ West Virginia registered 330 first downs during the 2012 season, moving the chains an average of 25.4 times a contest.

The 330 first downs in 2012 set the school record, previously set in 2011 when WVU posted 301 first downs.

The Mountaineers were No. 5 in the Big 12 Conference and No. 14 nationally. WVU had 188 passing first downs, 119 by the run and 23 by penalty. WVU set the school record (188) for most passing first downs, topping the 2011 mark of 187.

The Mountaineers had a season-high 33 first downs against Baylor, 10 by the run, 22 by the pass and one by penalty. The passing first downs were the most since having 23 against LSU in 2011. The 33 first downs against Baylor were the most total first downs since posting 35 at Syracuse in 1993.

In 2012, the 14 rushing first downs against Oklahoma and Iowa State were the most since putting up 15 against Bowling Green in 2011. The four by penalty against Oklahoma were the most since collecting eight by Norfolk State earlier in 2011.

West Virginia finished with 32 first downs against Oklahoma and Kansas, 31 against Marshall and has had 25 or more in eight games during the 2012 season.

### All-Purpose Mountaineers

✓ Tavon Austin, Stedman Bailey and Andrew Buie were versatile members of the West Virginia football squad. Austin ranked No. 2 nationally in all-purpose yardage, and Bailey finished at No. 25. The trio are three of the best in the Big 12 Conference, ranking one, three and 11, respectively, on the all-purpose yardage chart.

Austin finished with a school-record 2,910 all-purpose yards in 2012, breaking his then school record of 2,574 he accumulated in 2011. He also set the school career record with 7,286 yards, breaking Noel Devine's mark of 5,761 yards.

Austin finished with a school-record 572 all-purpose yards against Oklahoma, missing the NCAA mark by six yards. He had seven games with 200 or more all-purpose yards in 2012 and 10 games with 150 or more yards. He had 285 yards against Baylor, 261 at Iowa State, 225 yards against Maryland, 222 yards at Texas and 187 yards against Kansas.

Austin's 150 yards against Syracuse marked his 21st straight game with 100 or more all-purpose yards, including 10 games with 200 or more yards. Top performances for him include 287 yards against LSU in 2011 and 285 yards against Baylor in 2012.

Austin led the nation in all-purpose yards in 2011, totaling a single-season school record 2,574 yards and averaging 198 yards per game. He was No. 6 nationally in punt returns (14.1) and No. 20 in kickoff returns (26.1).

Bailey had a team-high 152 all-purpose yards against Syracuse, giving him 100 or more yards in eight games in 2012. He had a team-high 303 yards against Baylor, and also had top all-purpose performances of 227 against Oklahoma, 225 at Oklahoma State, 192 yards against James Madison and 173 against Kansas. Bailey had 15 performances of 100 yards or more of all-purpose yards during his career.

Buie had four performances of 100 or more all-purpose yards in 2012, including a game-high and personal-best mark of 281 yards at Texas. Those four 100 or more all-purpose yard performances are the first of his career as well.

### Red Zone Report

✓ West Virginia scored on 83.1 percent (49/59) of its trips to the red zone in 2012. WVU missed on 10 attempts in the red zone during the season, seven drives that ended on downs (two at Texas Tech and at Oklahoma State, one against Marshall, Kansas State and Oklahoma), one that ended the game against the Wildcats and two missed field goals (TCU, Syracuse).

The Mountaineers were a season-best 9-of-9 against Kansas, 7-of-7 at Texas and scored on 5-of-5 drives against Baylor and against James Madison. WVU has scored touchdowns in 41 of the 59 red zone trips, 17 by the run and 24 by the pass, and eight field goals. West Virginia scored 59 points from trips to the red zone against Kansas, 41 points at Texas, 35 against Marshall, JMU and Baylor, 29 against Oklahoma, 27 at Oklahoma State, 17 at Iowa State, 14 at Texas Tech, seven against Kansas State and TCU and three against Maryland.

Defensively, WVU's opponents scored on 53-of-64 times (82.8 percent) in the red zone, including 41 touchdowns and 12 field goals. The 11 failed attempts were two by interception, two by fumble, three by downs and four missed field goals.

## Austin Sets All-Purpose Marks

✓ Along with being one of the top receivers for WVU, Tavon Austin saw his first significant time as a ball carrier against Oklahoma and set the school rushing record with 344 yards on 21 carries, an average of 16.4 yards per carry, and scored two touchdowns. He collected 82 receiving yards on four catches and finished with 146 yards on eight kickoff returns. In all, he totalled 572 all-purpose yards, setting the WVU and Big 12 Conference records. He finished six yards shy of the NCAA record.

## Scoring Four Ways

✓ Tavon Austin scored four different ways in 2012 - three rushing touchdowns, 12 receiving touchdowns, one by punt return and one by kickoff return.

He was the first player in West Virginia history to accomplish the feat.

Austin, along with Tennessee's Cordarrelle Patterson, were the only two players in NCAA FBS who have scored four different ways in 2012.

## Alston Had Career Day at Iowa State

✓ West Virginia running back Shawne Alston led the Mountaineer running attack the first two games in 2012, and then was hampered with a thigh bruise until making his return against TCU, although he wasn't 100 percent.

For the season, he finished with 386 yards on 75 carries, an average of 5.1 yards per rush and tied for the team rushing touchdown lead with seven.

Against Iowa State, he had a career-high 130 yards on 19 carries, averaging 6.8 yards per carry, and a touchdown. He had a long run of 21 yards.

Alston finished with 123 yards on 16 carries and two touchdowns against Marshall. He averaged 7.7 yards per carry and had a long run of 21 yards.

The Marshall game also marked the sixth game of his career in which he had double-figure touchdown scores.

## Stacking Sacks

✓ West Virginia collected 23 sacks this season, averaging 1.8 per game.

WVU had a season-high five sacks against Maryland, posted four against James Madison in game two and had three against Baylor in game four and TCU in game eight.

Thirteen different Mountaineers have joined in on a sack during the 2012 season, led by Terence Garvin with six and Josh Francis with 4.5.

## Buie Runs for 100 Against Kansas

✓ Sophomore Andrew Buie led the Mountaineers' run game against Kansas, finishing with 100 yards on 12 carries, an average of 8.3 yards per rush and a touchdown. That marked his second 100-yard rushing performance of the 2012 season, as he registered a career-best 207 yards on 31 attempts, an average of 6.7 yards per carry and two touchdowns at Texas.

For the season, Buie led the Mountaineers with 851 yards on 179 carries, an average of 4.8 yards per run and tied for the team lead with seven touchdowns. He finished ranked No. 9 in the Big 12 in rushing.

## Offensive Line

✓ West Virginia's offensive line did a solid job blocking in 2012. The first team unit has paved the way for the offense to average 39.5 points and 502.0 yards of total offense a game.

For the season, Jeff Braun led WVU in knockdowns with 62 (4.8 per game), followed by Quinton Spain with 57.5 knockdowns (4.4) and Josh Jenkins with 52.5 (4.0).

Top knockdown performances this season include: 10.5 by Spain against Marshall, eight by Braun against Marshall, seven by Jenkins at Texas and by Joe Madsen against Baylor, four by Curtis Feigt against Oklahoma, three by Pat Eger against Marshall, James Madison, Texas Tech and Oklahoma State, and one by Nick Kindler at Texas Tech and against Baylor.

Behind the blocking of the line in 2011, the Mountaineer offense averaged 37.6 points per game and finished with more than 4,500 yards passing and more than 6,100 yards of total offense. WVU ranked No. 6 nationally in passing offense, No. 13 in scoring offense and No. 15 in total offense.

Madsen led the offensive line with 55 knockdowns, averaging 4.2 per game, and Braun had 52, averaging 4.0 per game. Eger compiled 24 knockdowns, and Spain had 15. As a junior, Jenkins finished with 42 knockdowns in 2010.

## Third-Down Conversions

✓ For the 2012 season, the Mountaineers converted 44.0 percent (80/182) of their third-down attempts, including 44.4 percent (20/45) in the first quarter, 44.9 percent (22/49) in the second quarter, 49.0 percent (24/49) in the third quarter, 36.8 percent (14/38) in the fourth quarter and 00.0 percent (0/1) in overtime. West Virginia finished No. 7 in the Big 12 in offensive third-down conversion percentage and tied for No. 36 nationally.

Opponents connected on 45.6 percent (89/195) of their third-down attempts, including 48.9 percent (23/47) in the first quarter, 44.7 percent (21/47) in the second quarter, 45.5 percent (20/44) in the third quarter, 44.6 (25/56) in the fourth quarter and 00.0 percent (0/1) in overtime.

West Virginia converted 45 percent or better of its third-down attempts in eight of the 13 games in 2012. The Mountaineers posted a season-high 80.0 percent (12/15) of their third downs against Baylor. WVU connected on 70.0 percent of its third-down attempts against Kansas (7/10), 62.5 percent of its third-down attempts against Marshall (5/8) and 57.1 percent of its attempts against Oklahoma (8/14).

### Tackling in the Backfield

✓ The Mountaineer defense finished with 86 tackles for loss during the 2012 season, averaging 6.6 a game. WVU ranked No. 3 in the Big 12 and No. 32 nationally.

West Virginia posted a season-high 10 tackles for loss against Marshall and Maryland, had nine against Oklahoma and JMU and seven at Oklahoma State and at Iowa State.

In 2012, Josh Francis led the team with 15 tackles for loss, Terence Garvin had 11.5, Karl Joseph finished with 7.0 and Isaiah Bruce, Will Clarke, and Jorge Wright each had 6.5 tackles for loss.

### At Home

✓ The 2012 season marked the 33rd season of competition for West Virginia at Mountaineer Field at Milan Puskar Stadium. WVU holds a 150-54-4 (.731) all-time record at the facility, which opened in 1980.

The Mountaineers had two sellouts in 2012, having 60,101 against Kansas State and 60,012 against Baylor. WVU had just under sellout crowds against Marshall (59,120) and Maryland (58,504).

West Virginia averaged 55,916 a game for attendance in 2012, and a total of 11,349,634 fans all-time have watched a game at Mountaineer Field.

### Joseph Leads Mountaineers in Tackles and Interceptions

✓ Freshman safety Karl Joseph led the Mountaineer defense in tackles (104), unassisted tackles (76), tied for the team lead in interceptions (2), tied for the team lead in forced fumbles (3), was second in pass breakups (6) and was third in tackles for loss (7).

He was named a first team Freshman All-American by *collegefootballnews.com* and *FoxSports.com* and a second-team selection by *Phil Steele*. He finished ranked No. 3 in the Big 12 Conference in unassisted tackles, tied for No. 5 in forced fumbles and total tackles. He finished with seven or more tackles in 11 games and had a season-best two tackles for loss against Marshall.

Joseph was the second-leading tackler for WVU against Syracuse with nine stops. He tied Darwin Cook and Shaq Petteway for the team lead with seven tackles against Kansas. He forced a fumble, broke up a pass and had his second interception of the season. He had double-figure tackle performances against Oklahoma (10) and at Iowa State (13). He finished with 12 unassisted tackles against the Cyclones.

### Bruce Tied For Team Interception Lead

✓ Redshirt freshman linebacker Isaiah Bruce was No. 2 on the team in tackles with 94, including 51 unassisted tackles, had two fumble recoveries, including one that he returned for a 43-yard touchdown against Marshall, and was tied for fourth on the team with 6.5 tackles for loss. He made his first career interception against TCU, and returned it 12 yards and had his second against Syracuse.

Bruce, who was named a Freshman All-America first team by *collegefootballnews.com* and second team by *Phil Steele* and *FoxSports.com*, finished the 2012 season ranked No. 11 in the Big 12 in tackles and tied for No. 6 in fumbles recovered.

He posted double-figure tackle performances against Marshall (16), Baylor (13) and Texas (10). He had a season-high seven unassisted tackles against Marshall, Texas and TCU, and had a season-high two tackles for loss against James Madison. He also had seven or more tackles in seven games.

Against Marshall, he was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week after he collected a season-high 16 tackles, including seven solo stops, had a tackle for loss and returned a fumble 43 yards for a touchdown. Bruce's 16-tackle performance was good enough for second best by a freshman in school history behind defensive back Mike Collins, who finished with 17 against South Carolina in 1990.

### Looking into the Numbers

✓ In 2012, the Mountaineer offense saw action on 998 plays and the defense was used on 992 plays.

Of WVU's 998 plays, five players registered more than 900 offensive plays and eight players were used on more than 800 plays. Quinton Spain led the team for the 2012 season with 967 plays, Geno Smith was used on 959 plays, Jeff Braun on 942 plays and Joe Madsen on 932 plays.

Of WVU's 992 defensive plays, Terence Garvin was the only defensive player used on more than 900 plays, finishing with 910. have recorded more than 800 plays, six with more than 600 plays and nine with more than 500 plays. Terence Garvin leads the defense with 818, Karl Joseph has seen action in 800 plays and Pat Miller was used on 689 plays. Karl Joseph was used on 890 plays, Pat Miller on 768 plays, Darwin Cook on 748 and Isaiah Bruce on 739 plays.

Three players were used on 200 or more special teams' plays and 24 were saw action on 100 or more plays. Wes Tonkery led WVU on special teams' plays with 247, Cody Clay was used on 216 plays and Nana Kyeremeh saw action on 209 plays. Including special teams' plays, there were six players used on 1,000 or more plays, led by Spain with 1,051 plays. Garvin saw action on 1,042 plays and Braun was used on 1,026 plays.

**MORGANTOWN, W.Va. (Sept. 1, 2012)** - West Virginia started the 2012 season right where it left off in January, at the Discover Orange Bowl, with an offensive explosion that produced a 69-34 victory over Marshall in the "Friends of Coal Bowl."

Quarterback Geno Smith got his senior season started in spectacular fashion, completing 32-of-36 passes for 323 yards and four touchdowns, while adding a 28-yard rushing score.

The Mountaineers started fast and never looked back, jumping out to a 13-0 lead in the first quarter on Smith's 32-yard touchdown toss to Stedman Bailey and Shawne Alston's three-yard rush.

Marshall cut the deficit to 13-7 at the 11:16 mark of the second quarter, when running back Travon Van scored from four-yards out to cap a 14-play, 98-yard drive for the Thundering Herd. However, the rest of the half belonged to West Virginia.

The Mountaineers outscored the Herd 21-3 in the final 11 minutes of the first half to take a 34-10 lead into the locker room. Tailback Andrew Buie scampered in from 24-yards out, and Smith connected on scoring tosses of six yards to Tavon Austin and nine yards to J.D. Woods, giving WVU the 24-point advantage.

Third quarter action saw the Mountaineer offense continue to click as a seven-play, 64-yard drive on the quarter's opening possession ended with a 21-yard Alston run and a 41-10 WVU advantage.

Marshall capitalized with a three-yard Van touchdown run after blocking a punt, but West Virginia never flinched and went on to again score 21 points in the quarter. Smith improvised on a broken play for a 28-yard touchdown run, and linebacker Isaiah Bruce picked up a Herd fumble and returned it 43 yards for a touchdown and a 55-17 West Virginia lead with 3:41 left in the third.

After a 29-yard Justin Haig field goal cut the Herd deficit to 55-20, heading into the fourth quarter, the Mountaineers added two more scores in the final stanza on Smith's five-yard toss to Bailey, which was setup by a 52-yard completion from Smith to Ivan McCartney, and K.J. Myers' first career score on a three-yard reception from Paul Millard.

With the score at 69-20, Marshall added two late fourth-quarter scores to make the final outcome look closer. Tommy Shuler caught a 12-yard pass from Rakeem Cato, and Eric Frohnapfel an 11-yard pass to end the game's scoring.

Aside from Smith's sparkling numbers, several Mountaineers posted impressive performances. Alston finished with 123 yards rushing and two scores, Buie totaled 80 yards on the ground

and one score, Austin caught 10 passes for 53 yards to go along with a 70-yard run, and Bailey finished with nine catches for 104 yards. In his Mountaineer debut, Bruce finished with 16 tackles and the fumble return for a score, while fellow linebacker Doug Rigg had one interception for a 46-yard return. Linebacker Terence Garvin also was strong with 12 tackles, one sack, two TFL and forced the fumble that Bruce returned for the touchdown.

For Marshall, Cato passed for 413 yards, completing 38-of-54 attempts, and Dominick LeGrande and Alex Bazzie combined for 24 tackles to pace the defense.

Final statistics showed West Virginia with 331 yards rushing and 324 passing for 655 yards of total offense. Marshall totaled 132 yards on the ground and 413 in the air for 545 yards of total offense.

With the win, West Virginia improved to 12-0 all-time against Marshall.

# No. 9/8 West Virginia 42, James Madison 12

**LANDOVER, Md. (Sept. 15, 2012)** - West Virginia scored on its first four possessions and never looked back in defeating James Madison 42-12 at FedExField in Landover, Md.

Quarterback Geno Smith was outstanding once again and completed 34-of-39 passes for 411 yards and five touchdown passes. Smith's favorite target was Stedman Bailey, who caught a school-record 13 catches for 173 yards and three scores.

Fellow receiver Tavon Austin also got in on plenty of action with 11 catches for 113 yards and one touchdown. Austin and Bailey's receiving performances marked the first time since 1981 that two Mountaineers caught 10 or more passes in a game.

Running back Shawne Alston got the scoring started with a two-yard score at the 10:16 mark of the first quarter. The 71-yard scoring drive was followed by a 64-yard drive that ended with a nine-yard scoring toss to Bailey.

On West Virginia's third possession, a 77-yard drive was capped off with a three-yard touchdown pass to Bailey, giving West Virginia a 21-0 lead after one quarter.

Redshirt freshman receiver Dante Campbell caught the first touchdown of his young Mountaineer career with a four-yard toss from Smith at the 10:15 mark of the second quarter. That touchdown pass ended an 86-yard drive, and put WVU's first four scoring drives at 71, 64, 77 and 86 yards.

With 1:02 left in the half, James Madison got on the board with a 33-yard field goal by former Mountaineer reserve kicker Cameron Starke, cutting the deficit to 28-3 at the half.

The Dukes played their best football in the third quarter, and after stopping WVU on 4th-and-2, took control of the ball at the Mountaineer 48. Five plays later, JMU had a first and goal at the WVU three, but four great goal line stands by the Mountaineer defense turned James Madison away.

However, Alston was tackled in the end zone by JMU's Dean Marlowe on WVU's first play from scrimmage, giving the Dukes a safety and bringing the score to 28-5.

West Virginia responded with an eight-play, 70-yard drive, that ended with Smith finding Bailey from 30-yards out and a 35-5 Mountaineer advantage.

James Madison continued its offensive movement after the score, and drove 57 yards down to the WVU 6, but Mountaineer linebacker Tyler Anderson thwarted the scoring attempt by intercepting Duke quarterback Justin Thorpe in the end zone with 1:14 left in the third quarter.

The goal line stand and the interception in the end zone ended James Madison's chances to tighten the game. With 14:56 remaining in the

game, West Virginia closed out its scoring with a five play, 80-yard drive, ending with a seven-yard strike to Austin. Completions of 30 and 27 yards to tailback Andrew Buie were big plays in the drive.

The Dukes added a 20-yard scoring run by Jauan Latney with just 49 seconds left to finish the scoring.

Aside from the offensive numbers, top defensive performances from the Mountaineers came from linebackers Isaiah Bruce and Terence Garvin, who combined for 17 stops.

Jordan Anderson rushed for 75 yards for the Dukes, and tight end Brian Barlow had two catches for 46 yards, while Jakarie Jackson led the defense with 14 tackles.

Final numbers showed West Virginia with 121 yards rushing, 448 passing and 569 total yards. JMU finished with 188 rushing, 112 passing and 300 yards of offense.

The win gives West Virginia a 2-0 record all-time against James Madison.

**MORGANTOWN, W.Va. (Sept. 22, 2012)** - West Virginia used a big defensive play for the second year in a row to defeat Maryland, 31-21, in front of 58,504 fans at Milan Puskar Stadium.

Linebacker Doug Rigg's 51-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown coupled with Tavon Austin's three touchdowns proved to be enough for the Mountaineers to down the upstart Terps.

Rigg's recovery started the scoring after WVU's Darwin Cook blitzed Terp true freshman quarterback Perry Hills to force the fumble. Rigg handled the rest, giving the Mountaineers a 7-0 lead at the 7:14 mark of the first quarter.

West Virginia extended the lead to 14-0 on its next possession, when quarterback Geno Smith hit Austin for a 44-yard touchdown reception at the 4:24 mark to end a 78-yard drive in just two plays.

However, Maryland answered before the end of the quarter, when Hills connected with receiver Stefon Diggs for a 42-yard touchdown strike, cutting the Terp deficit to 14-7.

After falling behind by 14 points, the Terrapins answered with 14 straight points of their own and tied the game at the 12:16 mark of the second quarter, when Hills hooked up with receiver Marcus Leak for a 12-yard scoring toss.

The Mountaineers responded with 10 unanswered points to close out the half. Tyler Bitancurt connected on his first field goal of the season, from 37 yards, to put the Mountaineers up by three with 7:40 left.

Smith connected with Austin for the second time on the afternoon with a 24-yard scoring reception, giving the Mountaineers a 10-point lead at 24-14.

The Terps' Brad Craddock missed a 42-yard field goal attempt as the half ended, preserving WVU's 10-point lead.

Third quarter action was relatively quiet as both defenses held. West Virginia did get on the board again with 8:18 left in the game on a 34-yard touchdown from Smith to Austin for the pair's third touchdown of the game.

The 31-14 Mountaineer lead did not last long, as Maryland struck back with its own big aerial play. Hills hit Diggs for a 56-yard scoring play for the duos' second-scoring connection in the game, bringing the Terrapins' deficit back to 10, at 31-21, with 7:25 to go.

The Terp offense had one more possession, but WVU's Wes Tonkery came up with his first career interception, and the Mountaineers ran out the remaining clock for the hard-fought victory.

Austin's 13 overall catches in the game enabled him to pass Jock Sanders as WVU's all-time receptions leader. The 13 receptions in the game tied teammate Stedman Bailey for the school record

for most catches in a game. Smith finished with 338 yards passing, while Rigg and Karl Joseph led the defense with a combined 14 tackles.

Hills had the best day so far of his young career with 305 yards passing and three scores. Fellow freshman Diggs finished with three catches for 113 yards and two touchdowns. The Terp defense was led by Dexter McDougle and Demetrius Hartsfield with a combined 15 tackles.

Final totals showed a very evenly played game. WVU rushed for 25 yards and passed for 338 to total 363 yards of offense with 19 first downs. Maryland rushed for 46 yards and passed for 305 to total 351 yards of offense with 18 first downs. Time of possession showed Maryland with 31:14 compared to WVU's 28:46, as turnovers and the big defensive play again spelled the difference in this border rivalry.

The win gave WVU seven straight victories in the series against Maryland.

## Game No. 4

### No. 9/7 West Virginia 70, No. 25/24 Baylor 63

**MORGANTOWN, W.Va. (Sept. 29, 2012)** - In West Virginia's inaugural Big 12 football game, an old fashioned offensive shootout broke out that saw 133 combined points in the Mountaineers' 70-63 victory over Baylor.

The game featured great offensive performances from both sides, but none better than Geno Smith's 656 yards passing and eight touchdowns. Smith's performance earned him the Walter Camp National Player of the Week honor and gave WVU its historic first win in the Big 12.

To go along with Smith's outstanding school-record totals, receiver Stedman Bailey set WVU receiving marks with 303 yards and five touchdowns. Teammate Tavon Austin turned in a 215-yard receiving performance and two touchdowns, while third receiver J.D. Woods hauled in 13 catches for 114 yards.

Baylor was in on the record-setting, too, as quarterback Nick Florence passed for 581 yards and five scores, with a stadium-record 314 yards going to Terrance Williams. The Bears also turned in three 100-yard receiving performances, as Tevin Reese finished with 120 yards and Lanear Sampson had 109 along with Williams' numbers.

The 133 combined points were a Big 12 and WVU record, while Baylor's 63 points were a stadium record. Both teams combined for a stadium record of 1,507 yards, as West Virginia finished with 807 total yards to Baylor's 700.

In the end, more than 17 records were broken in the barnburner that introduced West Virginia fans to Big 12 football in an explosive way.

After one quarter of play, the score stood tied at 14-14, as Baylor used a one-yard Jarred Salubi run, followed by a seven-yard Glasco Martin rush to light up its end of the scoreboard.

The Mountaineers were able to match the two Baylor touchdowns with a one-yard Andrew Buie rush and a seven-yard touchdown catch by Woods.

But the two teams were far from done, as each scored 21 points in the second quarter to knot the score at 35-35 at halftime.

For Baylor, Martin added another touchdown run, followed by Florence touchdown passes to Reese of 65 yards and a 67-yard bomb to Sampson.

West Virginia's answer was three touchdown passes from Smith to Bailey of 47, 20 and two yards for its 21 points in the quarter.

The Mountaineers then seemingly took control of the game in the third quarter by outscoring Baylor 21-7, but no lead was big enough. Three straight scores, including two touchdown receptions by Austin (45, 52 yards) and Buie's second one-yard touchdown run, put the Mountaineers up by the game's largest lead of 21. However,


Florence brought the Bears back to within 14 by the end of the third quarter.

A 37-yard Williams touchdown catch, before a Florence one-yard rush brought Baylor back within seven, 56-49, with 14:14 left.

However, the dynamic duo of Smith and Bailey struck again for touchdown receptions of 87 and 39 yards to counter Florence's touchdown passes of seven and eight yards to keep the Mountaineers ahead by a touchdown, and finally holding off the Bears.

A crowd of 60,012 striped Milan Puskar Stadium in sections of gold and blue to commemorate the game. Big 12 Commissioner Bob Bowlsby was on hand for the ceremonial coin toss and national recording star, Trace Adkins, sung the national anthem as part of the game's festivities.

The win improved West Virginia to 4-0, while Baylor fell to 3-1 on the season.

**AUSTIN, Texas (Oct. 6, 2012)** - In front of the largest crowd ever at Texas' DKR-Memorial Stadium, West Virginia won its first Big 12 road game in its first try with a thrilling a 48-45 victory in front of 101,851 fans.

A perfect weather night, in one of the great stadiums in college football, set the stage for West Virginia's first visit to Texas since 1956. Sophomore running back Andrew Buie turned in his best performance to date in a Mountaineer uniform, as he rushed for 207 yards and two scores, while registering three catches for 66 more yards to lead the offense.

West Virginia's defense came up big when it needed to on several occasions, by holding the Longhorns to field goal attempts on two drives, while making key fourth-quarter stops on third and fourth downs to thwart another Texas scoring threat.

West Virginia was able to start fast thanks to Tavon Austin's 44-yard return on the game's opening kick to set up good field position for senior quarterback Geno Smith. Five plays later, West Virginia had a 7-0 lead, when Smith hit Stedman Bailey for an eight-yard touchdown.

Texas bounced back to tie the score at 7-7 on its first possession. The big play came in the form of a 46-yard completion from David Ash to Daje Johnson that set up Joe Bergeron's two-yard rush.

West Virginia regained the lead at the 1:55 mark of the first, when Smith hit Tavon Austin for a 40-yard touchdown on fourth-and-four from the UT 40-yard line.

After a defensive stop, the Mountaineers opened up a 21-7 lead on Buie's four-yard rush that ended a 72-yard drive with 12:13 left in the second quarter.

However, the Longhorns quickly got back into the game and closed the gap to 21-14 at the 8:40 mark, when Bergeron powered in from two-yards out after a 49-yard run by Jonathan Gray put the ball at the WVU two.

Texas tied the score just over a minute later, when Alex Okafor sacked Smith and forced a fumble in the end zone that was recovered by Jackson Jeffcoat, bringing the Texas faithful to their feet.

The Mountaineers regained the lead with a 37-yard Tyler Bitancourt field goal, but it was short-lived. The Longhorns took their first lead at the 1:09 mark of the half, when Bergeron scored touchdown number three, this time from a yard out, as Texas moved 67 yards in just seven plays.

However, WVU used a 41-yard Bitancourt field goal, as the half expired, to close the score at 28-27 in favor of Texas. The Longhorns extended that lead to 31-27 on the first possession of the

third quarter on a Anthony Fera 38-yard field goal.

But the Mountaineers never flinched in front of the huge crowd and regained the lead, when Smith hit Bailey for a nine-yard touchdown pass. Just before the end of the third, Bergeron scored his fourth TD, giving the Longhorns a 38-34 lead, but Smith once again took control.

He directed two straight scoring drives of 76 yards, as his offense was a perfect five-for-five on fourth-down conversions in the game. Buie rushed for 102 yards in the final two drives, and the Mountaineers opened up a 48-38 lead. The Longhorns added a touchdown with just 15 seconds left, but it was too late, as the Mountaineers collected an impressive road victory in the heart of Big 12 country.

Final totals showed West Virginia with 460 yards of offense, while Texas came in at 404. Both defenses came up with big plays, but WVU made one more to help it improve to 2-0 all-time against the Longhorns.

## Game No. 6

### Texas Tech 49, No. 5/4 West Virginia 14

**LUBBOCK, Texas (Oct. 13, 2012)** - Texas Tech used six touchdown passes from senior quarterback Seth Doege to stun No. 5/4 West Virginia, 49-14, in front of 57,328 fans on Homecoming at Jones AT&T Stadium.

Doege threw for 499 yards and hit 11 different receivers, as the Red Raiders controlled the game from start to finish.

The Red Raider fireworks got started early, as they took the opening kickoff and scored in just 1:56, when Doege hit Jace Amaro for a 39-yard touchdown pass.

Later in the first quarter, Texas Tech showed that it not only could score quickly, but also with a controlled drive, as the Red Raiders used 12 plays to march 69 yards for their second score. This time, Doege hit Eric Ward from 19-yards out for a 14-0 Texas Tech lead with 6:00 left in the opening stanza.

West Virginia got on the scoreboard 1:39 later, when quarterback Geno Smith hit Stedman Bailey for a seven-yard scoring toss. The Mountaineers moved 54 yards in just five plays, highlighted by a 38-yard pitch and catch from Smith to Tavon Austin to set up the score.

Trailing 14-7 with 4:21 left in the first, the Mountaineers seemed to settle in after a couple of defensive stops. But the Mountaineer offense could not get on track, and Doege led his team to a 21-point second quarter to blow the game open.

At the 9:02 mark of the second quarter, Marcus Kennard's 16-yard touchdown reception capped off a three-play, 82-yard drive. A 62-yard completion to Amaro was the big play in the drive.

A nine-play, 86-yard drive by the Red Raiders followed at the 2:04 mark, giving Texas Tech a 28-7 lead on Darrin Moore's two-yard reception.

With West Virginia unable to score right before halftime, Texas Tech got the ball once more, and with just 52 seconds remaining, unleashed SaDale Foster for a 53-yard burst. In what seemed like running out the clock, Foster took advantage of a gapping hole in the West Virginia defense to give the Red Raiders a 28-point cushion at the half.

The score remained 35-7 until the 3:30 mark of the third, when Doege connected from 29-yards out with Moore to up the advantage to 42-7.

Texas Tech added one last touchdown with 5:37 left in the contest, when Doege threw his sixth touchdown pass and third of the day to Moore. The seven-yard pass play ended an impressive 98-yard drive by Tech.

West Virginia finally scored again with just 2:41 remaining, when sophomore tailback Dustin Garrison rushed in from two-yards out to end a 73-yard drive by the Mountaineers.

For West Virginia, Smith passed for 278 yards, with 92 of them going to Austin on 10 catches. Senior receiver J.D. Woods had a solid day with 79 yards receiving, and Karl Joseph led the defense with nine tackles.

Along with Doege's totals, Amaro was the favorite target, finishing with 156 yards receiving and one touchdown to go along with Moore's 92-yard receiving performance and three touchdowns. Linebacker Cody Davis had 13 tackles for the Red Raider defense.

Final numbers showed West Virginia with 130 yards rushing and 278 passing for 408 yards of total offense. Texas Tech enjoyed a banner offensive day with 168 yards on the ground and 508 through the air for 676 total yards.

Red Raider fans stormed the field after the upset, as Tech evened the series with West Virginia at 1-1, as the two teams met on the football field for the first time since 1938.

**MORGANTOWN, W.Va (Oct. 20, 2012)** - Kansas State quarterback Collin Klein was responsible for seven touchdowns, and the senior led the Wildcats to a 55-14 road victory over West Virginia in front of 60,101 fans at Milan Puskar Stadium.

Klein's big night consisted of four rushing touchdowns and three passing, as he accounted for 364 yards of total offense. His favorite target, receiver Tyler Lockett, hauled in nine catches for 194 yards and two scores, as the Wildcats jumped out to a 24-0 lead and never looked back.

Kansas State took the game's opening possession and converted a 33-yard Anthony Cantele field goal. The good news for the Mountaineers was that they held K-State to a field goal; the bad news was that the Wildcats would score touchdowns on their next seven straight possessions.

Klein hit Lockett on a 10-yard scoring pass at the 3:33 mark of the first quarter to give the Wildcats a 10-0 lead, heading into the second quarter.

Klein used the second stanza as a showcase for his running skills, scoring on touchdown runs of one, eight and one yards to end drives of 64, 75 and 78 yards. The Wildcats controlled the ball 11 minutes more in the first half to open up a 24-0 advantage.

West Virginia got on the scoreboard with 4:13 left in the first half, when Tavon Austin returned a kickoff 100 yards to cut the deficit to 24-7. The kickoff return marked Austin's fourth of his career for a touchdown, including the second 100-yard return for a score.

Klein's third touchdown run of the quarter, with just 17 seconds left, quickly took the crowd out of the game once again. Austin's kickoff return ignited the Mountaineer faithful for a short time, before Klein's run gave the Wildcats a 31-7 lead at the half.

The Mountaineers did receive the ball to start the third quarter, but quarterback Geno Smith's first interception in a then NCAA-record 273 passes set up the Wildcats once again deep in WVU territory. Two plays later, Klein hit receiver Chris Harper for a 21-yard strike and a 38-7 K-State advantage.

The Wildcats put 21 points on the board in the second quarter, and they would repeat the effort in the third.

Klein added another one-yard rushing touchdown at the 9:00 mark, and then hit Lockett for a 20-yard touchdown reception at the 2:25 mark to end a 77-yard drive, giving Kansas State a 52-7 lead heading to the fourth.

West Virginia got on the board again with 7:31 left in the contest, when Smith found Austin for a five-yard touchdown reception. However, Kansas State closed out the scoring with 3:48 left, when

Cantele connected on his second field goal, this time from 42-yards out, for the 55-14 victory.

Aside from Klein and Lockett's big night, receiver Chris Harper hauled in six catches for 96 yards, while Randall Evans and Arthur Brown paced the defense with a combined 17 tackles.

For West Virginia, Smith finished with 143 yards passing, and Austin accounted for both TDs and 233 all-purpose yards. Karl Joseph and Isaiah Bruce had nine tackles each for the WVU defense.

The Mountaineers finished with 88 yards rushing and 155 passing for 243 yards of offense. Kansas State gained 146 yards on the ground and 333 through the air for 479 yards of total offense.

The victory gave Kansas State a 2-1 lead in the all-time series against West Virginia, as this was the first game played between the two teams since 1931. All three games in the series have been played in Morgantown, and the Wildcats now have a two-game winning streak against West Virginia.

## TCU 39, No. 23/19 West Virginia 38 (2OT)

**MORGANTOWN, W.Va (Nov. 3, 2012)** - TCU erased a 10-point second half deficit and overcame several big plays from West Virginia to earn a 39-38 double-overtime victory at Milan Puskar Stadium.

Not only did the Horned Frogs erase the 10-point deficit, they overcame a late fourth-quarter punt return by WVU's Tavon Austin, a missed field goal in overtime, a seven-point deficit in the second overtime and then finally grabbed victory from the jaws of defeat with a gutsy two-point conversion on the game's final play.

The heartbreaking loss for WVU came on the heels of an improved defensive effort that held the Horned Frogs to just 4-of-17 on third down conversions and collected three TCU turnovers.

TCU grabbed an early 7-0 lead with 2:27 left in the first quarter on Matthew Tucker's two-yard run.

The second quarter saw a combined 28 points put on the scoreboard. West Virginia tied the game at 7-7, with 13:38 remaining, when receiver J.D. Woods fought the defender and came up with a 22-yard scoring reception.

TCU took advantage of a WVU interception and went back in front 14-7 on Josh Boyce's 31-yard touchdown catch from Trevone Boykin.

However, West Virginia scored the half's final 14 points for a 21-14 advantage at the intermission. Austin showed his speed on a 43-yard catch-and-go from Smith at the 9:47 mark, before the Mountaineers made TCU pay for a fumbled punt, when Shawne Alston burst in from one-yard out for WVU's 21st point of the quarter.

West Virginia made the Horned Frogs pay for another fumble in the third quarter, with a 52-yard Tyler Bitancurt field goal.

However, TCU kept coming, and made the Mountaineers pay for a fumbled snap on a punt, when Dominic Merka picked up the loose ball and raced 15 yards for the touchdown, cutting the deficit to 24-21 with 9:12 left in the third.

Missed scoring opportunities hampered the Mountaineers in the third quarter, and TCU tied the game at 24-24 on Jaden Oberkrom's 26-yard field goal with 12:01 left in the game.

The game remained tied until the 3:19 mark, when Austin returned a punt 76 yards for a touchdown. It was his first career punt return for a score, and seemed to be the game-winner, when the WVU defense next forced TCU out on downs. But the Horned Frogs had one last possession, with just over two minutes to play, and made the most of it, when Boykin hit Boyce for a 94-yard touchdown pass with just 1:28 left.

WVU missed a field goal with 18 seconds left in regulation, but TCU returned the favor with a missed attempt in the first overtime. West


Virginia's shot at the win ended, when Jason Verrett blocked Bitancurt's 29-yard field goal attempt.

In the second overtime, WVU struck on its first play, as Smith hit Stedman Bailey for a 25-yard touchdown. Not to be outdone, TCU scored on its first play with a reverse pass to Corey Fuller. TCU elected to go for two and got the win, when Boyce hauled in Boykin's pass just off the turf for the successful two-point conversion.

Top performances in the game included Boyce with 180 yards receiving and two scores for the Horned Frogs. WVU's Austin finished with 101 receiving yards and 202 all-purpose yards to lead the Mountaineers. TCU defenders Derrick Kindred and Sam Carter collected 10 tackles each along with WVU's Shaq Petteway.

West Virginia finished with 78 yards rushing and 260 passing for 338 yards of total offense. TCU's final numbers stood at 126 on the ground and 279 through the air for 405 yards of offense.

With the win, TCU evened the series against WVU at 1-1.

**STILLWATER, Okla. (Nov. 10, 2012)** - Oklahoma State used the big play, and took advantage of West Virginia special team miscues en route to a 55-34 victory over the Mountaineers at Boone Pickens Stadium.

The Cowboys accounted for 13 plays of 20 yards or more in the contest, and were led by third-string quarterback Clint Chelf, who threw for 292 yards and four touchdowns in the victory. Chelf's favorite target was receiver Josh Stewart, who hauled in 13 catches for 172 yards and two scores.

Special teams mistakes by the Mountaineers led to 17 points for Oklahoma State, but none were bigger than Justin Gilbert's 96-yard kickoff return for a score, which slowed West Virginia's momentum and gave the Cowboys a 14-point lead after one quarter of play.

Oklahoma State built a 14-point cushion to start the game, when Stewart rushed for a 46-yard score on OSU's first possession. Two Cowboy possessions later, Chelf hit Stewart for a 21-yard touchdown completion with 3:07 left in the opening quarter.

West Virginia got on the scoreboard before the quarter ended on a 37-yard touchdown pass from backup quarterback Paul Millard to Stedman Bailey. Geno Smith's helmet came off on the previous third-down play, so Millard replaced him for the fourth-down play and delivered a perfect strike to Bailey.

However, the joy was short-lived for WVU as Gilbert took the ensuing kickoff 96 yards for the 21-7 OSU lead, heading into the second stanza.

The Mountaineers used a 10-play, 64-yard scoring drive that ended with a 17-yard pass from Smith to Tavon Austin to cut the deficit to 21-14, but OSU closed out the half on a 10-3 run to take a 31-17 lead at the break. A Blake Jackson 48-yard touchdown reception, and a 26-yard field goal from Quinn Sharp countered Tyler Bitancurt's 41-yard field goal, putting OSU in the driver's seat.

West Virginia closed the gap to 31-24 on Ryan Nehlen's nine-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter, but then fell behind 38-24, when Chelf hit Charlie Moore for a five-yard toss after the Mountaineers muffed a punt.

Still, West Virginia kept battling. Bitancurt added a 37-yard field goal, and Terence Garvin's 42-yard interception return set up a Smith one-yard scoring plunge, and the deficit was down to just four, 38-34, with 5:20 left in the third.

But four points was as close as the Mountaineers could get. Oklahoma State went on a 17-0 scoring run to close the game and end any hopes of a Mountaineer comeback.

Sharp connected on a 32-yard field goal before the end of the third, and fourth quarter scores by

Stewart and Jeremy Smith put the game away for the Cowboys.

Bailey had a terrific day in leading the Mountaineers. He caught 14 passes for 225 yards, and Smith finished with 364 yards passing. Bitancurt was solid with two field goals and a punting average of 47.8 on five punts. Pat Miller, Jorge Wright and Isaiah Bruce led the WVU defense with a combined 16 tackles, one sack and three TFLs.

Aside from Chelf and Stewart, the Cowboys got 74 yards rushing from Joseph Randle, while Brodrick Brown and Shamiel Gary combined for 12 tackles to lead the OSU defense.

West Virginia won a lot of statistical categories in the game but not the main one on the scoreboard. The Mountaineers finished with 78 yards rushing and 401 passing to total 479 yards of offense. Oklahoma State ran for 151 yards and passed for 292 to total 443 yards of offense.

The win raised OSU to 6-3, while the Mountaineers dropped to 5-4.

**No. 13/12 Oklahoma 50, West Virginia 49**

**MORGANTOWN, W.Va. (Nov. 17, 2012)** - Despite one of the best individual performances in West Virginia football history, No. 13 Oklahoma made one more play count, defeating the Mountaineers, 50-49, at Milan Puskar Stadium.

Senior receiver Tavon Austin played tailback for the first time since high school and responded with a WVU record 344-rushing yards, coupled with 82 yards receiving and 146 on kickoff returns, and ended his night with an impressive 572 all-purpose yards.

Aside from the school single-game rushing mark, Austin's all-purpose yards were the most in school and Big 12 history, and the most in college football in 2012. It was second most in NCAA history, as he fell just six yards shy of the record.

With his two rushing touchdowns in the game, Austin became the first Mountaineer in school history to score a touchdown four different ways in a season (receiving, rushing, punt and kickoff return).

Austin got offensive help in the form of teammate Stedman Bailey, who had 13 catches for 205 yards and four touchdowns. It was Bailey's second straight 200-yard receiving effort, and it came on the heels of Geno Smith's 320-yard passing day against the Sooners.

However, Oklahoma had plenty of strong performances also to propel it to victory. Senior quarterback Landry Jones passed for 554 yards and six touchdowns to lead the Sooner offense.

Jones had 10 of his completions go to receiver Kenny Stills, who also caught four touchdowns. Jalen Saunders had 123 yards receiving, and Justin Brown added another 112, as the Sooners took an early lead and then battled back twice in the fourth quarter to win the game.

By taking the game's opening drive 75 yards, the Sooners jumped out to a 7-0 lead, when Jones connected with Trey Millard on a four-yard scoring toss. Kicker Mike Hunnicutt added a 32-yard field goal, before West Virginia's Tyler Bitancurt converted on a 19-yard kick to put the score at 10-3 in favor of Oklahoma, heading into the second quarter.

Both teams combined for 35 points in the second stanza. The Mountaineers tied the game at 10-10 at the 10:00 mark on Andrew Bui's one-yard rush. But the Sooners scored two-plays later on a 76-yard pass to Saunders, and on their next possession with a four-yard Stills touchdown catch to open up a 24-10 cushion.


The Mountaineers added a 33-yard touchdown reception by Bailey that ended a 91-yard drive, but Oklahoma answered with a 75-yard scoring drive and a 31-17 lead at the half, when Damien Williams burst through the line of scrimmage for a 48-yard touchdown run.

West Virginia outscored the Sooners, 13-7, in the third quarter on two Austin touchdown runs. The first went for 74 yards, and the second for four yards to cap off a 92-yard drive. However, a missed Bitancurt extra point on Austin's second score changed the game the rest of the way. Sooner points in the quarter came on an 11-yard catch from Stills, and the score was 38-30 in OU's favor, heading to the fourth.

Smith connected with Bailey on a four-yard score, closing the gap to 38-36 after the conversion failed. WVU grabbed its first lead at the 7:12 mark, 43-38, when Smith found Bailey again, this time from eight-yards out.

OU answered with a seven-yard touchdown from Jones to Stills and a 44-43 advantage, before the Smith to Bailey connection worked again on a 40-yard strike with just 2:53 left, putting WVU up 49-44. But Jones calmly led OU down the field and won the game with just 24 seconds left on his fourth TD pass to Stills on fourth-and-three.

Oklahoma finished with 662 yards, while WVU had a strong 778 yards of total offense.

**AMES, IOWA (Nov. 23, 2012)** - West Virginia broke a five-game losing streak with a Big 12 road victory at Iowa State in front of 53,792 fans on senior day at Jack Trice Stadium.

The return of a healthy running back in Shawne Alston certainly helped the Mountaineer cause, as a running game was established behind his 130 yards rushing and one touchdown. Alston averaged 6.8 yards per carry, and his powerful running allowed senior quarterback Geno Smith to have more options on the offensive side of the ball.

A strong wind plagued both teams for the entire game, but West Virginia was able to use the wind to its advantage in the first quarter. With the wind at his back, senior kicker Tyler Bitancurt connected on a 42-yard field goal to put the Mountaineers on top, 3-0, with 9:58 remaining.

West Virginia took the three-point lead into the second quarter and added to it, when Alston powered in from one-yard out to end a 70-yard drive. Smith completions to receiver Stedman Bailey of 27 and 23 yards highlighted the drive for the Mountaineers.

Trailing 10-0, Iowa State got on the board with 7:57 left in the half, when quarterback Sam Richardson found Jerome Tiller in the corner of the end zone for an eight-yard scoring play.

But, eight plays and 70-yards later, West Virginia took a 17-7 advantage, when Smith hit Bailey for a six-yard touchdown reception.

However, the Mountaineers could not hold the margin, as the Cyclones used a nine-play, 71-yard drive to cut the deficit to three at the half. Richardson hit Josh Lenz for an 18-yard touchdown pass with just 18 seconds remaining before intermission.

West Virginia kept the opening drive of the third quarter for 7:28 and came away with a 44-yard field goal from Bitancurt to extend its lead to 20-14.

The Cyclones took their first lead of the game, 21-20, with 4:56 left in the third, when Richardson found Quenton Bundrage for a 35-yard scoring toss.

Both teams traded scores in the final stanza, as the game would go down to the end. West Virginia regained the lead at the 9:35 mark on Bitancurt's 35-yard field goal.

Iowa State countered with a 49-yard field goal from Edwin Arceo for a 24-23 lead with just 6:42 remaining.

However, one play after the Cyclones took the lead, West Virginia's dynamic senior receiver, Tavon Austin, took charge and gave the Mountaineers the lead once again.

Austin took a flip pass from Smith and raced 75 yards for the score, before he converted the

two-point conversion from the backfield for a 31-24 WVU lead.


The Cyclones would threaten again, and reached the West Virginia seven-yard line, but safety Darwin Cook forced a Jeff Woody fumble that was recovered by Karl Joseph in the end zone to preserve the Mountaineer victory.

Aside from Alston's big day, Smith finished with 236 yards passing and two scores. Austin came in with six catches for 99 yards, along with 74-yards rushing for a total of 261 all-purpose yards. Joseph led the defense with 13 stops.

For ISU, Richardson passed for 162 yards and rushed for 119 to lead the attack. Linebacker A.J. Klein had 14 tackles.

Final totals show West Virginia with 239 yards rushing and 236 passing for 475 yards of offense. ISU finished with 234 rushing and 162 passing for a total of 396 yards.

With the win, West Virginia became bowl eligible for the 11th straight season.

### West Virginia 59, Kansas 10

**MORGANTOWN, W.Va. (Dec. 1, 2012)** - West Virginia closed the 2012 season in impressive fashion with a 59-10 victory over Kansas on senior day at Milan Puskar Stadium.

The seventh win of the season came on the heels of yet another strong performance by senior quarterback Geno Smith. Playing in his final game at Milan Puskar Stadium, Smith was near perfect, completing 23-of-24 passes for 407 yards and three touchdowns. After a first-half interception, Smith completed 21 straight passes, which set the WVU consecutive pass completion mark, breaking the old record of 14 that he set earlier in the season. Also, his completion percentage of 95.8 percent tied the NCAA record (min. 20 attempts).

His usual targets came through for him once again. Receiver Stedman Bailey caught 11 passes for 159 yards and two scores, while Tavon Austin had four catches for 110 yards, along with 77 rushing yards. With his 187 all-purpose yards, Austin broke his own mark from 2011 and set the single-season school record for that category.

The Mountaineers started strong and never looked back in taking the game's opening possession 68 yards for a score. Tailback Andrew Buie finished off the eight-play drive with a two-yard run and a 7-0 WVU lead.

West Virginia added another score in the quarter at the 2:08 mark on Shawne Alston's two-yard burst, ending a 77-yard drive.

WVU's 14-0 lead carried to the 11:34 mark of the second quarter, when Bailey hauled in an eight-yard Smith pass for a touchdown and a 21-0 advantage.

Kansas broke the Mountaineer scoring string with 7:05 remaining in the half. The Jayhawks marched 80 yards in nine plays, and got on the board on James Sims' one-yard rush, cutting the deficit to 21-7.

But West Virginia added two more scores before halftime, taking a commanding 35-7 lead at the half.

Alston rushed for his second score of the day on a one-yard plunge at the 3:29 mark, ending a 74-yard drive. Then receiver J.D. Woods closed out the first half scoring by grabbing an eight-yard toss from Smith with just 24 seconds remaining.

West Virginia put up 17 more points in the third quarter. The first three came on Tyler Bitancurt's 30-yard field goal at the 9:11 mark.

Bailey pulled in his second touchdown of the game, this one from 16-yards out that ended a 74-yard drive in just three plays.

Austin got in on the scoring with 1:31 left in the third. It was his key runs and receptions that set up most of the previous Mountaineer scores, and this time he finished the deal. After rushes of 15

and 17 yards, his one-yard stretch into the end zone gave the Mountaineers a 52-7 lead, heading to the fourth quarter.


Kansas got back on the scoreboard with 9:01 remaining on a Nick Prolago 32-yard field goal, finishing off a 60-yard drive for the Jayhawks.

As the Mountaineer seniors were taken out of the game to a thunderous ovation, WVU had one last score to end the game. Tailback Dustin Garrison scampered in from 26-yards out with 5:13 left to put an exclamation mark on the day.

Aside from WVU's fine offensive day, safety Karl Joseph led the defense with seven tackles and one interception. Darwin Cook and Shaq Petteway combined for 14 tackles in the win.

Final totals showed West Virginia with 240 yards rushing and 407 passing for 647 yards of offense. Kansas finished with 157 yards on the ground and 117 passing for 274 total yards.

The Mountaineers closed out the 2012 regular season with two straight wins and finished with a 7-5 record in their first year of Big 12 play, including a 4-5 league mark.
