No. 9/12 West Virginia Mountaineers (21-6, 9-5)

No. 9 West Virginia Hosts Texas on ESPN's Big Monday

- With 21 wins, it marks the 31st 20-win season in school history. Bob Huggins now has 28 20-win seasons in 35 years as a head coach. He has led WVU to seven 20-win seasons in his 10 years as a head coach at WVU.
- Bob Huggins became the 10th NCAA Division I head coach to win 800 games on Dec. 17 against UMKC.
- Bob Huggins is in ninth place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 812-327 in his 35th season as a head coach. Huggins trails Rollie Massimino by three wins and Jim Phelan by 18 wins.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- Last season, WVU won 13 Big 12 games and 11 two years ago. WVU is 33-17 in the Big 12 in the last two-plus seasons.
- West Virginia is 102-74 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games (Big 12 and Big East).
- Bob Huggins is 58-44 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 48-38 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- West Virginia is 154-36 in its last 190 games against unranked teams, including 81 of its last 92 at the WVU Coliseum.
- The Mountaineers have won 74 of their last 105 conference games at the WVU Coliseum.
- West Virginia is 117-32 at the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 60-28 mark in league games.
- WVU is 526-152 (.781) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 158-38 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 13 seasons.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 37 ranked teams at WVU, including 14 wins over Top 10 teams and three over No. 1.
- WVU became the first team since Indiana in 2011-12 to beat No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.
- WVU is the fourth team in AP history to beat an AP No. 1 and AP No. 2 by at least 15 points each in a single season.
- WVU's 21-point win over No. 1 Baylor was the eighth-largest margin victory ever against a No. 1-ranked AP team.
- WVU is 6-2 in its last eight games vs. AP Top 25 teams, with two wins over No. 1, one vs. No. 2 and two wins over No. 6.
- Jevon Carter needs 52 more points to become West Virginia's 51st 1,000-point scorer.
- With James Bolden's 17 points at OU, he became the seventh different WVU player to lead in scoring in a league game this year. He is the first player in school history to score 17 points while playing a maximum of 10 minutes in a game.
- WVU leads the country in turnover margin (9.3), turnovers forced (21.8) and steals (11.1). WVU ranks third in scoring margin (18.9), fourth in offensive rebounds (14.7), 14th in assists (17.1) and 10th in scoring offense (85.6).
- WVU's plus/minus leaders are Tarik Phillip (+358), Jevon Carter (+344) and Nathan Adrian (+326).
- WVU is averaging 42.5 deflections per game, while averaging 35.4 deflections in Big 12 Conference games.
- The Mountaineers forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- All but seven Mountaineer opponents have had at least 18 miscues this year, including three with more than 30. WVU has had 15 or more steals eight times in 2016-17.
- Baylor's 29 turnovers were the most forced by WVU in a league game in 24 years (30 vs. St. Bonaventure in 1992).
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 28.7 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- WVU has nearly forced more turnovers (589) than its opponents have made field goals (603).
- WVU has attempted 302 more shots than its opponents this season - 1,731 to 1,429.
- WVU's bench has scored 30 or more in 38 of the last 54 games. This year's team is averaging 35.2 points from the bench.
- WVU has shot 43 percent or higher in all but three games this season, including four games of 50 percent or higher.
- WVU finished in second place in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tournament last season.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 75 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 30 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 31 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 48 of the last 51 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked 51 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers have won 56 of their last 57 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU is 177-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 66 of its last 68 and 122 of its last 133 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 585 consecutive games.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 57 times under Bob Huggins (338 games).
- West Virginia is 60-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 173-31 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 181-19 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 153-11 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 165-32 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 162-40 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 23-17 all-time on Feb. 20 and 517-397 all-time in the month of February.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 811 games in 35 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks ninth among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 30 of 34 seasons, including 22 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 35 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six times.
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 64 all-conference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led West Virginia to seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

Scouting Texas

- Texas is 10-17 overall and 4-10 in the Big 12 following a 64-61 loss at home to Kansas State on Saturday.
- The Longhorns have lost three in a row. Their last win was against Iowa State on Feb. 7, 67-65 in Austin.
- Texas is 0-9 on the road this season, including an 0-7 mark in Big 12 road games.
- Shaka Smart, a 1999 graduate of Kenyon College, is 30-30 in his second year at UT. He is 193-86 in eight years overall.

Series Record Against Texas

- This will be the 14th meeting between West Virginia and Texas with the Longhorns holding a 8-5 series advantage.
- Texas has won six of the last eight meetings between the two schools. Texas won both games last season, but WVU won in Austin on Jan. 14 this season by a score of 74-72.
- Since WVU joined the Big 12, the Mountaineers are 4-6 against the Longhorns.
- WVU is 2-2 against Texas at the WVU Coliseum.
- The series began on Dec. 28, 1973, with WVU winning 80-79 in the Far West Classic in Portland, Oregon.
- Bob Huggins is 5-6 all-time against Texas (4-6 at West Virginia and 1-0 at Kansas State).

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,723-1,065 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 27 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 19 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 12 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and *Basketball Times* and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.

- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was dosed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

Winning Non-Conference Mark

- West Virginia finished with a winning non-conference mark for the 25th consecutive season.
- West Virginia is 133-32 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 13 seasons.
- The last time WVU did not post a winning non-league record was 1990-91, when WVU went 4-4 outside of conference.
- WVU is 102-26 in non-conference games under Bob Huggins.
- WVU has finished with one loss during non-conference play in eight different seasons. They were: 1981-82 when West Virginia went 11-1 out of the Atlantic 10, 1957-58 when WVU lost only to Duke in going 11-1, 1996-97 when the Mountaineers were 7-1, losing the season opener at Minnesota, 2004-05 when WVU went 10-1 outside the Big East, 2006-07 when the Mountaineers went 12-1 with their only loss to Arkansas, 2009-10 when WVU was 11-1 with its only loss at Purdue, 2014-15 when the Mountaineers had a one point home loss to LSU, finishing 12-1 and in 2016-17 when WVU finished 12-1 with a four-point loss to Temple in Brooklyn, New York.
- WVU has had one perfect non-conference regular season, 10-0, in 1997-98.

- The Mountaineers began the season No. 20 in the AP poll and No. 18 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- West Virginia has been ranked as high as No. 7 (three times in the AP poll) in both polls this season.
- The Mountaineers were ranked as high as No. 6 in the AP poll and No. 7 in the USA Today poll on Jan. 18 last season and finished No. 8 in the Associated Press poll.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 75 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 30 weeks in the AP Top 10.
- West Virginia has been ranked 95 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll, and 209 weeks total in school history.
- WVU has been ranked in 51 consecutive USA Today polls and for 31 straight weeks in the AP poll.

- WVU's 21-point win over No. 1 Baylor was the largest loss in AP poll history by a team in its first-ever game as No. 1.
- WVU's win at No. 6 Virginia this season was its first non-conference road win over a Top 10 team since winning at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 1957.
- WVU became the fourth team in the AP poll to beat an AP No. 1 and No. 2 team by at least 15 points each in a season.
- This season, West Virginia became the first team since Indiana in 2011-12 to beat No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.
- This season marks the first time WVU has defeated three AP Top 10 teams in the same season, and the first time WVU has ever beaten three AP Top 6 teams in the same year.
- WVU owns 93 wins over AP-ranked teams.
- Since 1995, the Mountaineers have played 182 nationally ranked teams. The school has played 295 total games against nationally-ranked competition. That means more than 61 percent of the games against the best teams in the country have come during the last 23 seasons.
- WVU has played 133 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 51 of those games.
- Bob Huggins has faced 86 ranked teams during the regular season in 10 years, the most in school history. Gale Catlett faced 66 ranked teams during the regular season in 24 years, while John Beilein faced 34 ranked teams during regular season play in five years.

- West Virginia was predicted to finish second in the Big 12 Conference preseason coaches' poll.
- Last year, the Mountaineers were predicted to finish sixth and finished second in the Big 12 regular season and conference tournament.

- Junior guards Jevon Carter and Dexter Miles Jr. were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable Mention team. The two Mountaineers were two of the 10 Big 12 Conference players earning preseason recognition.
- Carter started all 35 games a year ago and finished fourth in the Big 12 in steals and 11th in assists.
- Carter earned a spot on the All-Big 12 Defensive Team as a freshman and as a sophomore.
- Miles Jr. averaged 9.4 points per game, with 40 made 3-point field goals.
- He finished 11th in the Big 12 in steals per game a year ago.

Press Virginia

- Press Virginia is back in full swing for the Mountaineers for the third season in a row.
- West Virginia forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan.
- All but seven Mountaineer opponents have had at least 18 miscues this year, including three with more than 30.
- WVU has 15 or more steals eight times this season.
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 28.7 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- In 2014-15, the Mountaineers led the country in forced turnovers, steals and offensive rebounds. Last season, West Virginia led the country in forced turnovers.
- WVU outrebounded its opponents on the offensive glass 575 to 312 in 2014-15 and 558 to 306 last season.

WVU To Open 2017-18 Season in Germany

- West Virginia will open its 2017-18 basketball season in Germany against Texas A&M at Ramstein Air Base.
- The event is part of the Armed Forces Classic - a series of Division I men's basketball college games that are televised from United States military bases around Veteran's Day as a morale event for service members.
- WVU and Texas A&M will meet on Nov. 10, 2017, and it will be televised by ESPN.

WVU Coliseum Renovations

- The 46-year-old WVU Coliseum received a \$23-million facelift in 2016.
- The concession stands doubled from 21 points of sale in the past to 40 points of sale.
- The concourse level is adorned with new graphics, more color and easily recognizable signage to help fans to get to their seating locations more rapidly.
- Twelve new Daktronics LED boards have been added inside the inner bowl to add more color to the arena.
- Forty-three high definition television monitors have been added throughout the concourse.
- There have been 140 more toilets and three restrooms added in the concourse.
- As part of a private gift of \$1.3 million, WVU's locker room and hallway received a significant makeover.
- Phase two of the Coliseum project will involve seating improvements to the arena's interior and will start at the conclusion of the 2016-17 basketball season.

It was a 'Press Virginia' infomercial for West Virginia during the NIT Season Tip-Off at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York. The 19th-ranked Mountaineers smothered Illinois with their suffocating full-court pressure defense to run away with an 89-57 victory.

'It feels good to win any first,' said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins of the victory, WVU's first at Barclays Center following two losses here.

Nathan Adrian hit his season average with 13 points and Jevon Carter contributed 10 in a well-balanced WVU attack that saw nine different players score at least six points.

All 11 players who got into the game for West Virginia in the first half scored as it built a 19-point halftime lead. After a Maverick Morgan follow-up basket gave Illinois a 9-7 lead, West Virginia scored the next eight points and the used an 18-2 run to build a 25-11 lead.

Daxter Miles Jr., making his first appearance of the season, knocked down back-to-back 3s, and Brandon Watkins came off the bench to score a couple of close ones to key the run.

Miles played 17 minutes coming off the bench and finished with 8 points and two assists. West Virginia's lead swelled to 18 on two Lamont West free throws, but a six-minute dry spell allowed the Illini to make it a single-digit game with 4:50 left in the half when Michael Finke got his 3 to go down.

Miles ended the drought with a driving layup, and then WVU turned up its defensive pressure to get another quick basket on a breakaway dunk by freshman Maciej Bender.

Watkins hit a short jumper, Ahmad got another basket on a follow and West finished a strong first half by following Myers' miss just ahead of the buzzer.

It took Illinois four minutes to score to begin the second half and by that time West Virginia's lead was 31.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 39 points following a Bender follow-up basket with 4:42.

The Mountaineers finished the game shooting 45.8 percent and if not for missed free throws, the margin could have been far worse. WVU was just 17 of 30 from the charity stripe.

Illinois committed 24 turnovers and handled the basketball today like it was on fire, the Mountaineers scoring 34 points off those turnovers.

West Virginia nearly overcame a 20-point first half deficit, but the Mountaineers couldn't make the critical plays down the stretch to pull out the victory.

Temple got late free throws free throws from Alani Moore III and Obi Enechionya to hold off 19th-ranked WVU 81-77 to win the NIT Season Tip-Off played at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

It looked like the Owls might run away and hide with this one, Enechionya scoring 18 of his game-high 22 points in the first half as Temple built a 45-25 halftime lead. But West Virginia (4-1) came out with much more energy at the start of the second half, trimmed Temple's lead to eight, 60-52 with 11:51 to go, and then to three, 60-57, on an Esa Ahmad 3.

After Enechionya answered with a 3 - his first field goal of the second half - the Mountaineers turned the ball over on back-to-back possessions leading to four straight Temple free throws.

Quinton Rose and Myers traded field goals and then Daniel Dingle's layup gave Temple a four-point lead with 3:09 to go. Ahmad scored inside and was fouled on the play but he couldn't complete the traditional three-point play.

After Dingle got one of two to go down, Myers scored again to make it a one-point game. Here, Temple called timeout and Enechionya got a good look from the left elbow, but his shot came up short.

Ahmad was unable to grab the rebound, Miles Jr. fouled Moore near midcourt and he knocked down both free throws with 1:1 seconds left.

Huggins used his final timeout between Moore's free throw attempts to draw up a last-second play, but the best West Virginia could get to try and tie the game was a heavily contested step-in shot by Myers that was blocked from the wing.

Enechionya was fouled on the rebound and made the game's final point with 0.7 seconds remaining.

Temple won the game at the free throw line (21 of 24) and from behind the 3 point arc (10 of 19).

Esa Ahmad made all seven of his field goal attempts to lead 25th-ranked West Virginia with 19 points as the Mountaineers cruised to a 108-61 victory over Manhattan at the WVU Coliseum.

An announced crowd of 8,190 got to see coach Bob Huggins' entire team for a good portion of the second half after West Virginia built a 60-27 halftime lead.

'I thought we played pretty hard and we took better care of the ball for the most part,' said Huggins.

The Mountaineer defense forced Manhattan into committing a record 40 turnovers, the Jaspers spreading their miscues across the board.

Nathan Adrian scored 15 points, Dexter Miles Jr. contributed 11 and James Long came off the bench to score 10 in just eight minutes of action.

'James Long he's given so much to our program,' said Huggins. 'He gets other guys in the gym and he's got such a great work ethic so it was great to be able to get him in a little bit in the first half and play as much as he did in the second half.'

All 15 players who got into the game scored and 62 of the team's 108 points came from the bench.

Ahmad, coming off a 19-point performance to Temple, continued his strong play. He has made 15 of his last 20 field goal attempts in career-high duplicating performances.

'He gets better all the time, we've just got pushing up those expectations and try to keep that motor running that way all the time,' said Huggins. 'We all know he's a talented guy and I really think he's got a great advantage in this league being a 6-foot-7 three-man because there aren't very many of them.'

WVU shot 47.3 percent for the game and also hit 30 of 43 from the free throw line for 69.8 percent, an improvement over the 60.5 percent the team was shooting coming into tonight's game.

Manhattan got 11 points from Xavier Peart.

The win snapped Virginia's 24-game home winning streak, the sixth-longest home winning streak in the country.

WVU turned the ball over just eight times to Virginia's 14. WVU used the 3-ball to beat Virginia - a big one coming from Esa Ahmad with 1:30 remaining to give West Virginia a 58-55 lead.

Prior to that, freshman forward Lamont West hit two big 3s, the second coming with 4:36 left to give the Mountaineers a 52-49 lead.

Following Ahmad's 3 from the corner, Tarik Phillip made a driving layup to put West Virginia ahead by five, 60-55.

Jevon Carter then blocked London Perrantes' 3-point try at the other end, Nathan Adrian grabbed the rebound and he was fouled by Devon Hall with 27 seconds left and Adrian made both free throws.

On the next trip down the floor, Perrantes couldn't get another 3 to go down, Ahmad grabbed the rebound, was fouled by Hall, and hit two more free throws to make it a three-possession game with 15 seconds left.

Virginia (7-1) had an 11-point lead midway through the first half, 17-6, before West Virginia began finding some openings in Virginia's Pack Line defense.

A traditional three-point play from Carter reduced Virginia's lead to six, and then three straight baskets from Brandon Watkins, Daxter Miles Jr. and Ahmad pulled WVU to within one, 23-22.

A flagrant foul 2 called on Miles, causing him to be ejected from the game with 2:42 left in the first half, momentarily slowed the Mountaineers' momentum, but Teyvon Myers came in and responded with a short jumper to give WVU its first lead of the game, 24-23, with 27 seconds left in the half.

West Virginia shot 45.1 percent from the floor and made 16 of 19 from the free throw line in the victory. Virginia came into the game ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring defense giving up an average of just 44.1 points per game.

Notebook: It was West Virginia's first victory over a ranked non-conference opponent since beating No. 8 Maryland, 69-59, in a 2015 NCAA Tournament game played in Columbus, Ohio, and the first regular-season non-conference road victory against a ranked team since beating 15th-ranked Ohio State, 76-48, in Columbus on December 27, 2008.

It was also the first true non-conference road win over a top 10-ranked team since the Mountaineers defeated fifth-ranked Kentucky, 77-70, on December 20, 1957 - 59 years ago.

WVU played in Charlottesville for the first time since 1975.

We have six freshmen so if we're planning on playing those guys then we need to try and get them ready and that's the only way we can get them ready."

"It's just hard when you have five of them out there because you can't run anything," added Huggins.

Western Carolina shot just 26 percent from the field, turned the ball over 34 times and didn't have a player score more than six points.

"It's hard for them just because we don't let people run offense," said Huggins. "We make people play. (Western Carolina coach) Larry Hunter is a good coach and he runs really good sets, we just let people get into it. I think everybody gets to the point where they see other people turn it and you want to take care of the ball. The best thing to do is throw it backwards and it's hard to run offense when you're constantly throwing the ball backwards."

Notebook: The last time the leading scorer from an opposing team had six points or less was by Maryland on Dec. 14, 1946.

The last WVU opponent to score 37 or less points in a game was The Citadel on Dec. 20, 2006. WVU won that game 63-36.

WVU finished with a 37-0 advantage on points off turnovers.

The Mountaineers are now 66-20 in the Charleston Civic Center and 74-22 all-time in games played in Charleston.

Recap: West Virginia's full-court pressure defense eventually wore down VMI and the 15th-ranked Mountaineers cruised to their eighth victory of the season, 90-55, at the WVU Coliseum.

The win against 1-7 VMI was never in doubt, but the Keydets did hang around longer than most people expected.

VMI trailed by just five, 22-17 with 7:36 remaining in the first half and then by six with 4:34 left. Then, early in the second half the Keydets got a conventional three-point play from Will Miller to pull within 12.

The Mountaineers (8-1) were slow dosing out on defense, allowing VMI to convert eight 3s, permitted the much smaller Keydets to grab 13 offensive rebounds, missed several layups and was just 26 of 42 from the free throw line.

But eventually, the constant pressure got to VMI as West Virginia's lead swelled to 20 at the 10-minute mark, and then to 30 with 6:34 to go.

WVU's biggest lead was 38 with 3:16 remaining. Guard Daxter Miles Jr. made 5 of 6 from 3 and finished with a game-high 20 points. The junior became the first Mountaineer player to eclipse the 20-point barrier in 2016-17.

Esa Ahmad recovered from a poor first half to finish with 12, and senior forward Brandon Watkins came off the bench to give the Mountaineers a big boost with 11 points and 10 rebounds in just 17 minutes of action. That was his second career double-double.

Those three players combined to score 21 points, grab 18 rebounds and block four shots.

Freshman guard James "Beetle" Bolden finished with 9 points on three 3s, getting some extended work with the ones, including a second half start.

West Virginia once again dominated all of the specialty statistics, including a 27-3 advantage in points off of turnovers, a 34-9 edge in second-chance points and a 44-28 advantage in points off the bench.

Twelve different Mountaineer players got into the scoring column. Q.J. Peterson led VMI with 17 points.

The Keydets turned the ball over 22 times.

Recap

Eleventh-ranked West Virginia nearly led wire to wire in depositing Oklahoma State, 92-75, at sold-out Gallagher-Iba Arena in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

It was the Big 12 opener for both teams. With the exception Lucas N'Guessan's dunk to begin the game, Oklahoma State spent the rest of the day simply trying to get the ball in bounds and across the midcourt line against "Press Virginia," which made eight steals and forced 19 turnovers that translated into 26 points.

This game's outcome was more a matter of some stellar outside shooting from guards Dexter Miles Jr. and Jevon Carter against Oklahoma State's more highly touted backcourt of Jawun Evans and Phil Forte.

Miles' game-high 22 came on nine of 14 shooting, while Carter's 15 was the result of converting five out of 10 from the floor. Forte led Oklahoma State with 18.

Freshman forward Sagaba Konate came off the bench to contribute a season-high 12 points after taking junior Elijah Macon's spot in the rotation.

Brandon Watkins earned his second straight start and contributed nine points and five rebounds.

Three other players - Nathan Adrian, Esa Ahmad and Lamont West - added nine points each as West Virginia shot a sizzling 55 percent from the floor.

The Mountaineers were also fairly accurate from the free throw line, converting a better than usual 76.9 percent from the charity stripe. Following a Leyton Hammonds basket that reduced West Virginia's lead to 10-7, the Miles took control of the game with three straight layups to make it 16-7.

Jevon Carter was fouled by Evans attempting a 3, and his three free throws expanded West Virginia's lead to 12, 19-7. The margin mushroomed to 16 on a Konate stuff with 2:14 remaining before the Mountaineers settled for a 13-point advantage at the break.

On three occasions, Oklahoma State reduced its deficit to eight but each time West Virginia had answers.

The big response came following two Evans free throws when West Virginia scored seven straight points to push the margin back to 15. Another 3 from West with 12:03 remaining got the margin to 18, 61-43, which is about where it remained until Miles' driving layup with 4:21 left in the game made it 82-61, West Virginia.

Some late 3s from Forte kept the margin under 20.

Anthony Livingston's 3-point field goal with six seconds left lifted Texas Tech to a 77-76 overtime victory over seventh-ranked West Virginia at United Supermarkets Arena in Lubbock, Texas.

West Virginia (12-2, 1-1) had trouble stopping Tech's dribble penetration and was also victimized by fouls, the Mountaineers sending the Red Raiders to the free throw line 30 times where they made 20.

Meanwhile, WVU didn't help itself when it got to the foul line, West Virginia converting just 13 out of 24 for 54.2 percent. West Virginia's full-court pressure defense turned Tech over just 13 times - one fewer than the Mountaineers' 14 for the game.

The Red Raiders shot 51 percent from the field, including 53.8 percent from 3-point distance.

There were 21 lead changes with the game's biggest lead being seven points - that by West Virginia with 17:13 to go when Dexter Miles Jr. converted a driving layup off a feed from Nathan Adrian. But Texas Tech erased that within a span of five minutes when the Mountaineers went ice cold from the floor.

Texas Tech's scoreless spell came near the end of regulation after Justin Gray's layup with 2:20 left put the Red Raiders ahead by five.

Lamont West's two free throws reduced Tech's lead to three, and then Adrian banged in a 3 with seven seconds left to tie the game at 67.

Shadell Millinghaus tried to win it for Tech in regulation but his 3 was off the mark just ahead of the horn.

In overtime, missed free throws by Tarik Phillip, Miles Jr., Esa Ahmad and Adrian - six in all - kept Tech in position to get the upset.

Two Jevon Carter free throws pushed West Virginia's lead to three, 70-67, but two at the other end by Aaron Ross and then a turnaround jumper by Smith gave the lead back to Texas Tech, 71-70.

Ahmad followed with his two misses at the line before Phillip was able to get two to go down with 2:15 left, putting WVU back ahead, 72-71.

Stevenson answered with a 3 - his second - to make it 74-72. Then, Adrian could only get one of two to go down from the line before Phillip followed a Devon Thomas miss with a 3 to put West Virginia ahead, 76-74, with 33 seconds remaining.

The Red Raiders came down and worked to get into position for a late shot, with Livingston taking it off a feed from Stevenson. Carter had a chance to win the game for West Virginia at the other end but he couldn't get his 3 to go down with one second left.

Daxter Miles Jr. scored 22 points and Jevon Carter banged in three critical 3s during a key stretch late in the second half to lead seventh-ranked West Virginia to an 82-70 victory over TCU inside the WVU Coliseum.

In a battle of two 12-2 teams both looking to go 2-1 in Big 12 play, the game boiled down to the final 9:47 when West Virginia outscored the Horned Frogs 25-13.

TCU, which trailed by as many as 13 points in the first half, and then again by 11 with 13:12 remaining, used a 15-4 run to tie the game at 57 following a Desmond Bane layup with 9:47 to go.

But Miles answered with a layup and Sagaba Konate followed with a traditional three-point play when he was fouled by Vlad Brodziansky while scoring near the basket. Konate's free throw pushed West Virginia's advantage to 62-57.

Then three minutes later, Carter took control of the game with the Mountaineers leading by just four. Following a missed jumper by TCU's Alex Robinson, Carter came down on the other end and drilled a 3 from the top of the key. The next time down the floor, following a basket by Bane, Carter drained another. This one put WVU ahead by eight, 71-63.

His third came with 2:52 left to put the Mountaineers ahead by nine, 74-65. Konate followed with another lay in and then a steal by Nathan Adrian led to Miles' 3 from the corner to make it a 15-point game with two minutes to go.

West Virginia (13-2, 2-1) used an 18-9 run over the remaining six minutes by holding the Horned Frogs to just three field goals during that stretch of time.

Overall, TCU committed 18 miscues leading to 28 West Virginia points - a deciding factor in the game.

Esa Ahmad added 16 points on seven-of-11 shooting, while Carter and Konate contributed 13 points each. For Konate, who also grabbed eight rebounds coming off the bench, it was a season high in scoring for him.

Adrian, despite scoring just four points, was also a big contributor in the victory by grabbing a game-high nine rebounds, handing out five assists and making two steals. He played a team-high 34 minutes.

Robinson led TCU with 17 points on three-of-nine shooting. Brodziansky added 14 on five-of-six shooting. Overall, the Horned Frogs made 46.2 percent from the floor and were 17-of-21 from the free throw line - attempting seven more free throws and making eight more than the Mountaineers (nine-of-14).

An announced crowd of 12,568 watched the game.

The 14,074 saw a combined 54 fouls called on both teams, including two technicals issued to West Virginia.

K-State attempted 40 free throws but converted just 27 - several misses coming in one-and-one situations.

Neither team shot the ball particularly well in the first half, but the Wildcats did get four 3s to go down and converted four more free throws than the Mountaineers did.

However, K-State continued to shoot poorly in the second half while West Virginia found its shooting touch by spreading the floor and taking the basketball to the rim. The Mountaineers made 20 of 34 in the second half for 58.8 percent, mostly on drives to the basket or follow-up makes.

WVU had a 21-rebound advantage on the glass, including 13 offensive boards, with Johnson sitting on the bench watching the game in street clothes. Freshman Lamont West and Carter led the way with nine rebounds each for West Virginia.

Esa Ahmad was the only other WVU player to reach double figures in points with 11.

Wesley Iwundu led Kansas State with 14. He also turned the ball over six times.

No. 3 Kansas used a 21-7 run over the remaining 2:20 to send the game to overtime, and then outscored ninth-ranked West Virginia 13-9 in the extra session to pull out a near-miraculous 84-80 victory at Allen Fieldhouse in Lawrence, Kansas.

Frank Mason III scored 24 points - 16 coming from the free throw line, and Devonte' Graham contributed 18 to help Kansas avoid back-to-back losses at home for the first time since 1989.

The Mountaineers, looking to win for the first time ever in Lawrence, was in control of the game leading by 14 points, 64-50, with three minutes remaining.

Then, they self-destructed when Kansas went to a full-court press after Mason's 3 pulled the Jayhawks to within nine, 64-55.

However, WVU still appeared to be in good shape with 1:07 to go when Tarik Phillip got two free throws to go down to make it 69-62.

But Graham's two free throws with 52 seconds left reduced West Virginia's lead to five. Here, Landon Lucas stole the inbound pass and followed Frank Mason's miss to make it a three-point game with 47 seconds left.

Esa Ahmad's two free throws briefly put West Virginia ahead, 71-66, but Graham came down and drilled another 3 with 36 seconds left to make it a two-point game, 71-69.

Another West Virginia turnover, this one by Phillip, led to two Mason free throws with 21 seconds to go.

He made both, knotting the score at 71.

Immediately in overtime, Graham nailed the fourth of his five 3s and another Phillip turnover led to Josh Jackson's driving layup and a five-point lead. That put West Virginia in chase-mode for the remainder of the game.

Graham hit his fifth triple to give Kansas an eight-point lead, 79-71, its biggest of the game.

Then, Daxter Miles Jr. made the play of the game when he jumped above everyone to tip in Carter's miss with his left hand.

Miles got another massive put-back with 1:42 to go when he dunked Adrian's dose one that wouldn't go down.

This time, West Virginia made its free throws down the stretch - all four coming from Tarik Phillip - to salt away its first overtime victory of the season.

West Virginia wasn't able to close this one out in regulation despite leading by six with 2:44 to go.

Two big missed free throws by Miles Jr. with 2:10 left opened the door for Tech to score a couple of quick baskets and put the pressure back on the Mountaineers. Another miss at the line, this one by Carter with 27 seconds left and West Virginia leading by three, opened the door for Tech to tie it.

The Red Raiders couldn't miss in regulation, shooting 54.5 percent in the first half and then 64.5 percent in the second. But in the two overtime periods Tech hit just two of 15 and missed all four of its 3-point field goal tries.
