No. 15/16 WVU Travels to Charleston to Face Western Carolina

- West Virginia is 65-20 all-time at the Charleston Civic Center. WVU is 73-22 all-time in Charleston.
- Bob Huggins is in ninth place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 797-322 in his 35th season as a head coach. Huggins needs nine wins to tie Eddie Sutton for eighth place all-time.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- Bob Huggins has 27 20-win seasons and 16 25-win seasons in 34 seasons as a head coach.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 35 ranked teams at WVU, including 12 wins over Top 10 teams.
- WVU's win at No. 6 Virginia was its first over a Top 10 team in a true non-conference road game since winning at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 1957.
- WVU leads the country in turnover margin (14.7), turnovers forced (25.43) and steals (13.1).
- Jevon Carter leads the Big 12 Conference in steals, while Nathan Adrian ranks second in offensive rebounds.
- The Mountaineers forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- All but one Mountaineer opponent has had at least 19 miscues this year, including two with more than 30. WVU has had 15 or more steals four times in 2016-17.
- This season, WVU has forced 178 turnovers and has grabbed 113 offensive rebounds in five games.
- WVU has taken 115 more shots than its opponents this season -- 482 to 367.
- WVU's bench has scored 30 or more in 26 of the last 34 games. This year's team is averaging 43.0 points from the bench.
- The Mountaineers' bench scored 62 points against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- WVU led the country last year with its bench averaging 33.3 ppg.
- WVU scored 60 points in the first half against Manhattan. WVU scored 64 points in the first half against Mississippi Valley State, marking the first time in school history WVU scored 60 or more points in the first half in two games in a season.
- Esa Ahmad finished with 19 points for the second consecutive game against Manhattan. He has shot 50 percent or better in four of the last five outings, including 75 percent in two of the last three contests.
- WVU has shot 43 percent or higher in every game this season. WVU shot 40 percent or better in 25 games last season, including eight games of 50 percent or higher.
- West Virginia is 96-26 in non-conference regular season games under Bob Huggins, including a 52-4 mark at home.
- West Virginia is 86-6 at home against non-conference teams in the last 14 years, including 67 of its last 71.
- West Virginia is 123-32 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 13 seasons.
- WVU has won 112 of its last 141 non-conference games and 117 of its last 147 non-league contests (includes postseason).
- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship last season, dating back to 1955.
- WVU finished in second place in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tournament.
- Last season, WVU made its seventh NCAA appearance in the last nine years and ninth appearance in the last 12 seasons.
- WVU has made 12 postseason appearances in the last 13 years, including the NCAA Final Four in 2010.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 65 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 25 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history. Fred Schaus (1954-60) had WVU ranked for 60 weeks during his career.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 21 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 38 of the last 41 weeks in the AP rankings.
- West Virginia has been ranked 85 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll, and 198 weeks total in school history.
- The Mountaineers have won 47 of their last 48 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 565 consecutive games.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 54 times under Bob Huggins (318 games).
- WVU is 168-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 57 of its last 59 and 113 of its last 124 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia is 56-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 160-27 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 168-16 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 142-10 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 151-27 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 153-36 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 16-5 all-time on Dec. 7 and 382-159 all-time in the month of December.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 797 games in 35 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks ninth among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 30 of 34 seasons, including 22 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 34 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six times.
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 64 all-conference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led West Virginia to seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

Scouting Western Carolina

- Western Carolina is 3-5 overall following a 58-53 win at Appalachian State on Saturday.
- The Catamounts also own wins over Hiwassee (87-47) and at Jackson State (58-47).
- Larry Hunter is in his 12th season at West Carolina, where his record stands at 174-192. He is 683-416 in 36 years as a head coach.

Series Record Against Western Carolina

- This will be the second meeting between West Virginia and Western Carolina.
- The only other meeting took place on Dec. 18, 2002, an 82-55 WVU win in Morgantown.
- Larry Hunter is 4-4 against West Virginia. All eight of those meetings came when Hunter was at Ohio University.
- Bob Huggins is 1-0 against Western Carolina. His Cincinnati team defeated the Catamounts, 99-72, in the season opener on Nov. 23, 1996.
- West Virginia, a member of the Southern Conference from 1950-68, is 86-11 against current members of the Southern Conference: The Citadel (8-2), East Tennessee State (2-0), Furman (24-4), UNC Greensboro (3-0), VMI (44-5), Western Carolina (1-0) and Wofford (4-0).

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,708-1,060 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 27 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 19 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 12 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015. Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and *Basketball Times* and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations Rod Thorn and former Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was dosed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

- The Mountaineers began the season No. 20 in the AP poll and No. 18 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers were ranked as high as No. 6 in the AP poll and No. 7 in the USA Today poll on Jan. 18 last season and finished No. 8 in the Associated Press poll.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 65 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 25 weeks in the AP Top 10.
- West Virginia has been ranked 85 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll, and 198 weeks total in school history.
- WVU has been ranked in 41 consecutive USA Today polls and for 21 straight weeks in the AP poll.

- WVU's win at No. 6 Virginia this season was its first non-conference road win over a Top 10 team since winning at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 1957.
- WVU owns 91 wins over AP-ranked teams.
- Since 1995, the Mountaineers have played 179 nationally ranked teams. The school has played 292 total games against nationally-ranked competition. That means more than 60 percent of the games against the best teams in the country have come during the last 23 seasons.
- WVU has played 130 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 49 of those games.
- Bob Huggins has faced 83 ranked teams during the regular season in nine years, the most in school history. Gale Catlett faced 66 ranked teams during the regular season in 24 years, while John Beilein faced 34 ranked teams during regular season play in five years.

- WVU is 516-150 (.777) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 148-36 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 13 seasons.
- WVU's average margin of victory at home last year was +22.4. WVU averaged 83.3 points per game at home last year.
- Under Bob Huggins in the WVU Coliseum, WVU is averaging 79.7 ppg while holding its opponents to 61.9 ppg.
- West Virginia has won 141 of its last 173 games against unranked teams, including 73 of its last 82 at the Coliseum.
- Bob Huggins has posted 38 conference road victories in nine seasons at WVU, including six Big 12 road wins last season and four Big 12 road wins two years ago.
- West Virginia is 93-69 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games.
- Bob Huggins is 48-39 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 38-33 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.

- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship in 2015-16.
- WVU has reached the Sweet 16 in six of its last 11 NCAA appearances: (2015, 2010, 2008, 2006, 2005 and 1998).
- West Virginia's basketball staff has 65 years of Division I head coaching experience.

Carter, Miles Jr. Earn All-Big 12 Honors

- Junior guards Jevon Carter and Daxter Miles Jr. were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable Mention team. The two Mountaineers were two of the 10 Big 12 Conference players earning preseason recognition.
- Carter started all 35 games a year ago and finished fourth in the Big 12 in steals and 11th in assists.
- Carter earned a spot on the All-Big 12 Defensive Team as a freshman and as a sophomore.
- Miles Jr. averaged 9.4 points per game, with 40 made 3-point field goals.
- He finished 11th in the Big 12 in steals per game a year ago.

Press Virginia

- Press Virginia is back in full swing for the Mountaineers for the third season in a row.
- The Mountaineers currently lead the country in steals, forced turnovers and ranks second in offensive rebounds.
- West Virginia forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan.
- All but one Mountaineer opponent has had at least 19 miscues this year, including two with more than 30.
- WVU has 15 or more steals four times this season.
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 32.9 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- In 2014-15, the Mountaineers led the country in forced turnovers, steals and offensive rebounds. Last season, West Virginia led the country in forced turnovers.
- WVU outrebounded its opponents on the offensive glass 575 to 312 in 2014-15 and 558 to 306 last season.
- WVU forced 30 or more turnovers in three games last season. WVU had at least seven steals in all but six games and forced 14 or more turnovers in all but five games.

WVU To Open 2017-18 Season in Germany

- West Virginia will open its 2017-18 basketball season in Germany against Texas A&M at Ramstein Air Base.
- The event is part of the Armed Forces Classic - a series of Division I men's basketball college games that are televised from United States military bases around Veteran's Day as a morale event for service members.
- WVU and Texas A&M will meet on Nov. 10, 2017, and it will be televised by ESPN.

WVU Coliseum Renovations

- The 46-year-old WVU Coliseum received a \$23-million facelift in 2016.
- The concession stands doubled from 21 points of sale in the past to 40 points of sale.
- The concourse level is adorned with new graphics, more color and easily recognizable signage to help fans to get to their seating locations more rapidly.
- Twelve new Daktronics LED boards have been added inside the inner bowl to add more color to the arena.
- Forty-three high definition television monitors have been added throughout the concourse.
- There have been 140 more toilets and three restrooms added in the concourse.

Recap

West Virginia forced 21 turnovers that turned into 26 points and that powered the 20th-ranked Mountaineers to a season-opening 87-59 victory over Mount St. Mary's at the WVU Coliseum.

A curious crowd of 10,510 got their first look at the newly renovated concourse area to the 46-year-old arena, and then watched the same old Bob Huggins' Mountaineers run away with another non-conference home victory.

"Generally when you miss free throws the way we missed free throws, and you are as careless with the ball the way we were today, you're not really ready to play," said Huggins. "We just weren't very good."

Nathan Adrian led a balanced stat sheet with 13 points on four-of-six shooting, freshman Sagaba Konate came off the bench to contribute 11 points and six rebounds and Jevon Carter added 10.

"I was really encouraged with Sags. I thought Sags played really well; protects the basket, he rebounds the ball, he catches the ball so I was happy with him," said Huggins.

Eleven different players had double-digit minutes, no starter played more than Carter's 27 and eight different guys scored seven points or more.

West Virginia (1-0) shot 47.8 percent from the floor, hit 17 of 29 from the free throw line, made six of 18 from 3 and never trailed in the game, leading by 19 at halftime and reaching its biggest margin of 29 at the end of the game.

The Mountaineers grabbed 19 offensive rebounds, blocked seven shots - three coming from junior forward Elijah Macon - and made six steals.

Mount St. Mary's (0-1) got 15 points from Greg Alexander, 14 from Elijah Long and 11 from Miles Wilson.

West Virginia had a 45-32 edge on the glass in a game that featured a foul a minute - a combined 46 in 40 minutes of action.

"I was extremely disappointed in the second half with the pressure when they just kept driving down and shooting layups," said Huggins. "That hasn't happened in two years and now all of a sudden with this group it's happening."

It was a "Press Virginia" infomercial for West Virginia during the NIT Season Tip-Off at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York. The 19th-ranked Mountaineers smothered Illinois with their suffocating full-court pressure defense to run away with an 89-57 victory. "It feels good to win any first," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins of the victory, WVU's first at Barclays Center following two losses here. Nathan Adrian hit his season average with 13 points and Jevon Carter contributed 10 in a well-balanced WVU attack that saw nine different players score at least six points. All 11 players who got into the game for West Virginia in the first half scored as it built a 19-point halftime lead. After a Maverick Morgan follow-up basket gave Illinois a 9-7 lead, West Virginia scored the next eight points and the used an 18-2 run to build a 25-11 lead. Dexter Miles Jr., making his first appearance of the season, knocked down back-to-back 3s, and Brandon Watkins came off the bench to score a couple of close ones to key the run. Miles played 17 minutes coming off the bench and finished with 8 points and two assists. West Virginia's lead swelled to 18 on two Lamont West free throws, but a six-minute dry spell allowed the Illini to make it a single-digit game with 4:50 left in the half when Michael Finke got his 3 to go down. Miles ended the drought with a driving layup, and then WVU turned up its defensive pressure to get another quick basket on a breakaway dunk by freshman Maciej Bender. Watkins hit a short jumper, Ahmad got another basket on a follow and West finished a strong first half by following Myers' miss just ahead of the buzzer. It took Illinois four minutes to score to begin the second half and by that time West Virginia's lead was 31. West Virginia's biggest lead was 39 points following a Bender follow-up basket with 4:42. The Mountaineers finished the game shooting 45.8 percent and if not for missed free throws, the margin could have been far worse. WVU was just 17 of 30 from the charity stripe. Illinois committed 24 turnovers and handled the basketball today like it was on fire, the Mountaineers scoring 34 points off those turnovers.

West Virginia nearly overcame a 20-point first half deficit, but the Mountaineers couldn't make the critical plays down the stretch to pull out the victory. Temple got late free throws free throws from Alani Moore III and Obi Enechionya to hold off 19th-ranked WVU 81-77 to win the NIT Season Tip-Off played at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York. It looked like the Owls might run away and hide with this one, Enechionya scoring 18 of his game-high 22 points in the first half as Temple built a 45-25 halftime lead. But West Virginia (4-1) came out with much more energy at the start of the second half, trimmed Temple's lead to eight, 60-52 with 11:51 to go, and then to three, 60-57, on an Esa Ahmad 3. Another 3, this one by Dexter Miles Jr. from NBA range, pulled WVU to within two, 62-60, and Teyvon Myers tied the game at 62 on a driving layup. Tarik Phillip gave West Virginia its first lead of the second half, 65-64, hitting the first of two free throws and Ahmad gave West Virginia a brief three-point advantage with a basket in dose. After Enechionya answered with a 3 - his first field goal of the second half - the Mountaineers turned the ball over on back-to-back possessions leading to four straight Temple free throws. Quinton Rose and Myers traded field goals and then Daniel Dingle's layup gave Temple a four-point lead with 3:09 to go. Ahmad scored inside and was fouled on the play but he couldn't complete the traditional three-point play. After Dingle got one of two to go down, Myers scored again to make it a one-point game. Here, Temple called timeout and Enechionya got a good look from the left elbow, but his shot came up short. Ahmad was unable to grab the rebound, Miles Jr. fouled Moore near midcourt and he knocked down both free throws with 1.1 seconds left. Huggins used his final timeout between Moore's free throw attempts to draw up a last-second play, but the best West Virginia could get to try and tie the game was a heavily contested step-in shot by Myers that was blocked from the wing. Enechionya was fouled on the rebound and made the game's final point with 0.7 seconds remaining. Temple won the game at the free throw line (21 of 24) and from behind the 3-point arc (10 of 19).

Recap

West Virginia used a 7-0 run late in the game to upset sixth-ranked Virginia, 66-57, at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Virginia.

The win snapped Virginia's 24-game home winning streak, the sixth-longest home winning streak in the country.

WVU turned the ball over just eight times to Virginia's 14.

WVU used the 3-ball to beat Virginia - a big one coming from Esa Ahmad with 1:30 remaining to give West Virginia a 58-55 lead. Prior to that, freshman forward Lamont West hit two big 3s, the second coming with 4:36 left to give the Mountaineers a 52-49 lead.

Following Ahmad's 3 from the corner, Tarik Phillip made a driving layup to put West Virginia ahead by five, 60-55.

Jevon Carter then blocked London Perrantes' 3-point try at the other end, Nathan Adrian grabbed the rebound and he was fouled by Devon Hall with 27 seconds left and Adrian made both free throws. On the next trip down the floor, Perrantes couldn't get another 3 to go down, Ahmad grabbed the rebound, was fouled by Hall, and hit two more free throws to make it a three-possession game with 15 seconds left.

Virginia (7-1) had an 11-point lead midway through the first half, 17-6, before West Virginia began finding some openings in Virginia's Pack Line defense.

A traditional three-point play from Carter reduced Virginia's lead to six, and then three straight baskets from Brandon Watkins, Daxter Miles Jr. and Ahmad pulled WVU to within one, 23-22.

A flagrant foul 2 called on Miles, causing him to be ejected from the game with 2:42 left in the first half, momentarily slowed the Mountaineers' momentum, but Teyvon Myers came in and responded with a short jumper to give WVU its first lead of the game, 24-23, with 27 seconds left in the half.

West Virginia shot 45.1 percent from the floor and made 16 of 19 from the free throw line in the victory. Virginia came into the game ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring defense giving up an average of just 44.1 points per game.

Notebook

- It was West Virginia's first victory over a ranked non-conference opponent since beating No. 8 Maryland, 69-59, in a 2015 NCAA Tournament game played in Columbus, Ohio, and the first regular-season non-conference road victory against a ranked team since beating 15th-ranked Ohio State, 76-48, in Columbus on December 27, 2008.
- It was also the first true non-conference road win over a top 10-ranked team since the Mountaineers defeated fifth-ranked Kentucky, 77-70, on December 20, 1957 - 59 years ago.
- WVU played in Charlottesville for the first time since 1975.
